RECOMMENDATION

Receive An Informational Report On The Research Foundation Of The City University Of New York Grant Regarding Draft "Equity Indicators". Provide feedback to staff on the Draft "Equity Indicators".

BACKGROUND

At the October 10, 2017 Finance and Management Committee meeting, the Committee approved for forwarding to the full City Council a resolution accepting and appropriating a grant award from the Research Foundation of the City University of New York for the Equity Indicators project. At that time, the Committee requested that staff return with the draft equity indicators for further discussion.

ANALYSIS

The Equity Indicators framework requires that the indicators are comprised of hierarchy from highest to lowest: themes, topics, and indicators. All themes must have the same number of topics, and all topics must have the same number of indicators. Based upon this framework, staff has identified the following:

- 7 themes:
- 28 topics (4 per theme);
- 84 indicators (3 indicators per theme).

Table 1 below lists the draft themes, topics, and indicators. Staff is still in the process of identifying some indicators; these indicators are listed as "TBD."

- Housing & Community Development Department; and,
- Planning & Building Department.

In addition to City Staff, coordination occurred with similar data collection efforts currently being conducted by the Youth Joint Powers Authority.

Environmental: The grant provides financial assistance in the development an equity indicators platform intended to identify and track environmental and sustainability related race and equity disparities.

Social Equity: The grant provides financial assistance in the development an equity indicators platform intended to identify and track racial and equity disparities.
