If the Tenant does not so agree, then the entirety of the relocation payment is not due unless the Owner prevails in the unlawful detainer. If the Owner prevails in the unlawful detainer, the relocation payment must be paind to the Tenant prior to the Owner seeking a writ of possession for the Tenant to vacat the unit."
