5.81.150 - Restrictions on Approvals for Properties Used for Work/Live or Residential Purposes

A. No permit or local authorization shall be issued under OMC Chapters 5.80 or 5.81 to a cannabis

applicant at premises where either:

1. Work/Live use existed as of March 6, 2018; or 2. Residential use existed as of March 6, 2018. In both

the foregoing, this applies irrespective of any subsequent reconfiguration of the premises; or

2. Residential use existed as of March 6, 2018.

B. A permit or local authorization may be issued under OMC Chapters 5.80 or 5.81 to a cannabis

applicant utilizing different premises within a parcel of land that also contains Work/Live or residential
