RECOMMENDATION

Staff Recommends That The City Council Adopt The Following Resolutions:

- 1) Resolution Authorizing The City Administrator, Or Designee, To Accept And Appropriate Up To Ten Million Twenty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$10,025,000.00) In Federal Highway Administration And State Proposition 1B Funds For The Seismic Retrofit Of 23rd Avenue Bridge (Project No. 1001681).
- 2) Resolution Authorizing The City Administrator To Award A Construction Contract To Proven Management, Inc., The Lowest Responsive And Responsible Bidder, In Accordance With Plans And Specifications, For The Seismic Retrofit Of 23rd Avenue Bridge (Project No. 1001681) In The Amount Of Six Million Three Hundred Fifty-Eight Thousand Seven Hundred Seventy-Seven Dollars (\$6,358,777.00).
- 3) Resolution Waiving Further Request For Proposal/Qualification Competitive Selection Process Requirements And Authorizing The City Administrator, Or Designee, To Amend The Professional Services Contract With URS Corporation For Bridge Seismic Retrofit Projects By Increasing The Scope Of Work And The Contract Amount By Four Hundred Twenty Thousand Six Hundred Dollars (\$420,600.00) For A Total Contract Amount Not-To-Exceed One Million Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$1,250,000.00).

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The 23rd Avenue Bridge over Union Pacific Railroad (UPRR), located between East 11th Street and East 12th Street, was selected by the California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) for seismic retrofit as part of the seismic safety retrofit program. The City applied for and obtained \$10,025,000.00 of federal and state grant funding for the construction phase of the project to retrofit the bridge. The work is in Council District 5 as shown in Attachment A.

Adoption of these three (3) resolutions will allow the City Administrator to 1) accept and appropriate the grant funds into the project accounts, 2) execute a construction contract with Proven Management, Inc., the lowest responsive, responsible bidder, and 3) amend the

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professional services contract with URS Corporation to allow the Engineer of Record to provide construction support services during construction for the Seismic Retrofit of 23rd Avenue Bridge project. The proposed resolutions will facilitate the implementation of the bridge retrofit, which will provide a safer structure to resist future earthquakes.

BACKGROUND/LEGISLATIVE HISTORY

The 23rd Avenue Bridge over Union Pacific Railroad (UPRR) tracks, located between East 11th Street and East 12th Street, was selected along with other bridges in Oakland by Caltrans for seismic retrofit as part of the seismic safety retrofit program. URS Corporation was selected through a competitive process by Caltrans as the design consultant to design structural upgrades and prepare construction documents for the seismic retrofit of these bridges. The preliminary structural plans and specifications were forwarded to the City to complete the design.

In 2003, the City entered into a sole source contract with URS Corporation (Resolution No. 77815 C.M.S.) for a not-to-exceed amount of \$229,400.00 to start the additional design work needed for those bridge projects and obtain necessary permits and environmental approvals. In 2007, the City accepted \$1,277,229.00 in federal highway funds for the design phase of these bridges including the 23rd Avenue Bridge (Resolution No. 80461 C.M.S.). In 2012, the contract with URS Corporation was amended (Council Resolution No. 83699 C.M.S.) to increase the total contract amount to not-to-exceed \$829,400.00 for finalizing the design and providing construction support. In 2015, the City also accepted \$950,000.00 in federal and state funds for the right-of-way (ROW) phase of the 23rd Avenue Bridge project (Resolution No. 85817 C.M.S.) to modify existing utilities in conflict with the project.

Several unforeseen conditions were encountered and re-design work was needed that were not included in the original scope of work with URS Corporation. When securing permits from affected agencies, such as Caltrans, Bay Area Rapid Transit (BART), Union Pacific Railroad (UPRR), and the Oakland Alameda County Coliseum Authority, additional design work and coordination with these agencies were required, which resulted in increasing scope of work and lengthening the duration of the project.

The close proximity of the 23rd Avenue Bridge to the Caltrans I-880/23rd Avenue/29th Avenue project and the overcrossing of several UPRR tracks greatly affected the development of the project. The Caltrans project, which is currently under construction required close coordination between the two projects thus affecting the design schedule of the 23rd Avenue Bridge project. Furthermore, since two of the bridge footings and one of the bridge columns are within the right-of-way of UPRR, several design options were required to address UPRR concerns which had a further impact on the design phase of the 23rd Avenue Bridge project.

ANALYSIS / POLICY ALTERNATIVES

Acceptance and Appropriation of Grant Funding:

After the design and right-of-way (ROW) phases of the 23rd Avenue Bridge were completed, the

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City successfully sought and obtained federal and state funds in the amount of \$10,025,000.00 for the construction phase of this project. The grant will cover the cost of construction contract and construction support services by consultants and staff. Acceptance and appropriation of these grant funds will provide sufficient funds to construct the project.

Award of Construction Contract:

The Seismic Retrofit of 23rd Avenue Bridge Project was advertised for bids on May 18, 2018. Five bids were received on June 28, 2018, and they were at \$6,096,992.00, \$6,358,777.00, \$7,921,775.00, \$8,040,975.00, and \$9,240,844.00 as shown in *Attachment B*. The Engineer's Estimate was \$8,020,000.00. Because this project is funded by federal funds, the federal Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) Program must be used in lieu of the City's Local/Small Local Business Enterprise (LBE/SLBE) Program in determining qualified bidders.

Bids were analyzed by the Contracts and Compliance Division for DBE participation and Equal Benefits Ordinance (EBO) compliance and is shown in *Attachment C*. All bids have been deemed non-responsive, except for Proven Management, Inc., the second lowest bidder at \$6,358,777.00. Proven Management's bid has 18.07% DBE participation, which exceeds the 17.23% DBE participation goal. Proven Management, Inc. has been deemed the lowest responsive and responsible bidder and therefore is recommended for the award of the construction contract. Staff has reviewed the submitted bid for this work and has determined that the bid is reasonable and reflects the current construction climate.

The grant deadline to award the construction contract is October 23, 2018. Construction work is anticipated to begin in January 2019 and should be completed by December 2019 contingent on weather conditions as shown in *Attachment B*, under project schedule. The construction contract specifies \$5,100.00 in liquidated damages per calendar day if the contract is not completed within 240 working days.

Amendment for Construction Support Services:

The construction cost for retrofitting the 23rd Avenue Bridge is \$6,358,777.00. The estimated construction support provided by URS Corporation will be \$420,600.00 which is approximately 6% of the construction cost for this project. From past bridge retrofit projects, the construction support services are around 5% of the construction contract. However, this project requires additional construction support service because there will be retrofit work on two of the bridge footings which are within UPRR's right-of-way and right by its main tracks.

Therefore, the contract must be amended to support the project through construction. The duration of the contract needs to be extended and the contract amount needs to be increased by \$420,600.00 for a total contract amount not to exceed \$1,250,000.00. The increase in the contract amount will be fully reimbursed to the City by the project grant funding. URS Corporation's proposed amendment was analyzed by the Contracts and Compliance Division for DBE participation and Equal Benefits Ordinance (EBO) compliance and is shown in **Attachment D**.

URS Corporation, the Engineer-of-Record on this project, was acquired by AECOM USA, Inc. in October 2014 while the design phase for this project was still underway. AECOM USA, Inc. is

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not in compliance with the Nuclear Free Zone Ordinance 11478 C.M.S. because it is an affiliate of companies that fit the definition of a Nuclear Weapons Maker under the City ordinance. That being stated, AECOM USA, Inc. itself is not a Nuclear Weapons maker. As a result, the URS Corporation is not in compliance with the City ordinance.

Oakland Municipal Code ("OMC") section 2.04.51 requires the City to conduct a competitive Request For Proposals/Qualifications ("RFP/Q") selection process. However, per OMC section 2.04.051.A the Council can waive the RFP/Q requirement upon a finding that it is in the best interests of the City to do so. Also, the City Council can waive the Nuclear Free Zone Ordinance requirements upon a finding that there is no reasonable alternative product or service exists per section 6 (d) (1) of the Ordinance. Should the City undertake a new RFP process to bring on a different consultant, the project would not meet grant deadline requirements and risk losing federal and state grant funding. It is also important to have URS as the Engineer-of-Record provide the construction support services to ensure continuity of the original professional liability insurance. As such, staff recommends that the Council (1) find that there is no reasonable alternative product or service exists per section 6 (d) (1) of the NFO and waive the Nuclear Free Zone ordinance requirements and (2) waive, pursuant to Oakland Municipal Code (OMC) Section 2.04.051.B, the RFP/Q requirements because it is in the best interests of the City do so, based on the reasons and circumstances cited herein.

Typically, when a project is funded by federal funds, the federal Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) Program is used in lieu of the City's Local/Small Local Business Enterprise (LBE/SLBE) Program. However, in consultation with Caltrans staff, the City was advised that the DBE program will not apply for the amendment to URS Corporation's contract because the original contract did not require DBE participation since it was awarded as a sole source contract. Although LBE program is not required, URS Corporation will have 0.5% LBE participation for the entire contract including this amendment.

FISCAL IMPACT

Approval of these resolutions will allow the City Administrator to execute a construction contract with Proven Management, Inc., the lowest responsive and responsible bidder in an amount not-to-exceed \$6,358,777.00 and increase the contract amount with URS Corporation by \$420,600.00 for a total contract amount not-to-exceed \$1,250,000.00.

PUBLIC OUTREACH/INTEREST

During the design phase, staff met with the City Administrator's Office regarding the presence of homeless encampment at the project site. The relocation of the encampment will occur prior to the start of construction. Also, per standard City procedures, a notification letter will be sent to residents prior to start of construction.

COORDINATION

The Office of the City Attorney and the Controller's Bureau were consulted in preparation of this report and resolution. Also, the work to be done under these contracts was reviewed and coordinated with:

- The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans)
- Union Pacific Railroad (UPRR) company for right of entry permit.
- Oakland Fire Department (OFD)
- Safe Streets Division of the Department of Transportation (OakDOT)

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- Bureau of Infrastructure and Operations of the Oakland Public Works (OPW)
- Bureau of Facilities and Environment of the Oakland Public Works (OPW)
- Construction Management Unit of the Oakland Public Works (OPW)
- Contracts and Compliance Division of the City Administrator's Office

PAST PERFORMANCE, EVALUATION AND FOLLOW-UP

There is no Performance Evaluation on file for Proven Management, Inc. since this contractor never had a construction contract with the City nor are the Performance Evaluations for URS Corporation available for past projects. However, the City currently has an active contract with URS Corporation and it is performing in a satisfactory manner.

SUSTAINABLE OPPORTUNITIES

Economic: This project will improve bridge seismic reliability, ensuring continued safe use of the structure and improving the probability the bridge will remain functional following a seismic event, which is critical to rapid recovery. The rehabilitation of the bridge also reduces long-term maintenance costs.

Environmental: The contractor will be required to make every effort to reuse clean fill materials and use recyclable concrete product. The project will also implement the Best Management Practices for the protection of storm water runoff during construction to prevent pollutants from entering the storm drain systems.

Social Equity: This project is on the boundary of an area designated as high disadvantage by California's Metropolitan Transportation Commission (MTC) Disadvantage Index. Furthermore, the seismic retrofit of this bridge will enhance pedestrian and vehicular safety, thereby benefiting all Oakland residents.



Seismic Retrofit of 23rd Avenue Bridge (Project No. 1001681)


