RECOMMENDATION

Staff Recommends That The City Council Adopt A Resolution Authorizing the City Administrator Or Designee To Execute Professional Services Agreements For On-Call Structural Engineering Services Supporting Federal Projects With Three (3) Firms For Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000.00) Each To Biggs Cardosa Associates, Inc.; COWI North America, Inc.; And ARUP.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Approval of this resolution will authorize the City Administrator to execute on-call structural engineering professional services agreements with Biggs Cardosa Associates, Inc.; COWI North America, Inc.; and ARUP in the amount of two million dollars (\$2,000,000.00) each for a period of three (3) years. The professional services agreements are needed to provide on-call structural engineering services to assist the Department of Transportation (DOT) and other City departments in planning, design and engineering, and community engagement in delivering federally funded capital improvement projects expeditiously. Further, the selected consultant teams bring specialized expertise and augment capacity that is not available with existing city staff resources. These services will primarily be funded by Federal and State sources, such as Bridge Highway Program (BHP), Active Transportation Program (ATP), Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP), and various other grant sources. The approval of this resolution will not result in additional appropriation of funds. Funds will be identified prior to execution of each task order.

BACKGROUND/LEGISLATIVE HISTORY

The Oakland Department of Transportation (OakDOT), Great Streets Delivery Division, performs planning and design, for the City to deliver federally funded capital improvement projects. The On-Call Structural Engineering professional services agreements (Federal) are needed to assist OakDOT and other Departments and Divisions with various projects. Professional services include, but are not limited to, planning, design, surveying, plan

Item: _____ Public Works Committee December 4, 2018 preparation, permitting, construction management, technical studies, community engagement, special inspection, and technical support.

Examples of projects that services may be required in this recommended contract include bridge replacement/rehabilitation, buildings retrofit, landslide and other structural engineering projects. Examples of tasks under these projects include design, construction support and special inspection.

The City of Oakland (City) has received a significant amount of federal grant funding for street improvement and bridge projects. Due to this influx of grant funds, the level of funding represents a significant need of engineering and staff support for these projects. The City has historically retained lists of on-call consultants to provide engineering services to assist staff in delivering projects that are outside the technical scope of staff or require temporary increases beyond staff capacity.

In June 2018, OakDOT issued a Request for Qualifications (RFQ) to provide on-call structural engineering services for federally funded projects. The procedures for selection and contracting follow the requirements and guidelines detailed in the Caltrans Local Assistance Procedures Manual (Chapter 10 – Consultant Selection) for local agencies requesting reimbursement for consultant services. These procedures are in accordance with the Brooks Act (40 United States Code (USC), Section 1104) requiring local agencies to award federally funded engineering and design related contracts based on fair and open competitive negotiations, demonstrated competence, and professional qualifications (23 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR), Part 172), at a fair and reasonable price (48 CFR 31.201-3).

ANALYSIS AND POLICY ALTERNATIVES

With the passage of Measure BB, SB1, and Measure KK, as well as an influx of additional grant funding, the City is in a position requiring significant need of engineering services to support, design, and deliver projects. The on-call structural engineering services contracts provide a means for delivering projects and improvements in a timely and cost-effective manner.

The RFQ for On-Call Structural Engineering Services (Federal) is a part of a much larger coordinated effort to invite firms to provide professional and technical services to the City of Oakland on two (2) federally funded engineering disciplines and six (6) non-federally funded engineering disciplines. The two federally funded disciplines are for:

- (1) Civil Engineering
- (2) Structural Engineering (the subject of this report)

The six non-federally funded disciplines are for:

- (1) Civil Engineering
- (2) Geotechnical Engineering
- (3) Transportation Engineering and ITS
- (4) Plan Review, Permitting and Field Inspection
- (5) Land Surveying

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(6) Construction Management

The Structural Engineering professional services agreement contract for each of the three (3) firms is two million dollars (\$2,000,000.00). The duration of each contract is three (3) years, with an option to extend should capacity remain. These firms will support the City given the anticipated increase in the number of grant-funded projects in the coming years. The contract capacity and overall need for each of these disciplines was calculated based both on existing projects in early development, as well as future projects on the horizon.

On July 27, 2018, City Contract Services received six (6) submittals in response to the RFQ. A list of all firms that submitted Statement of Qualifications (SOQ) are below. All six (6) submittals met or exceeded the City's Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) goal of 33.00% participation. From these firms, four (4) firms are in compliance with the Equal Benefit Ordinance (EBO). All selected firms are required to be EBO compliant prior to contract execution. The information has been verified by the Social Equity Contract Compliance Memorandums and are provided in **Attachment A**. The following firms submitted a SOQ, in alphabetical order:

- ARUP
- Biggs Cardosa Associates, Inc.
- COWI North America, Inc.
- JMEC Engineering, Inc.
- Parsons
- Wood Rodgers

A panel of four professionals with experience in the scope of services and project typologies identified in the RFQ evaluated the submittals. The following evaluation criteria were used as set forth in the RFQ:

- Experience;
- Qualifications;
- Organization and Responsiveness; and
- Approach.

Based on the panel's evaluation results, contract requirements, and contract capacity needs, a recommendation was made for the most qualified firms to provide the needed on-call structural engineering services. Each of these selected firms clearly demonstrated their understanding of the scope and requirements in their submittals. The following firms are recommended for contracts, in alphabetical order:

- ARUP (Oakland based)
- Biggs Cardosa Associates, Inc. (Oakland based)
- COWI North America, Inc. (Oakland based)

As projects arise, the City will request on-call consultants with the appropriate expertise to submit proposals for the project that includes a scope of work, schedule for completion, and fee. The City will evaluate the proposals on a qualification basis, select a consultant, negotiate, and

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assign a Task Order. The on-call contracts are not for a specific project. No minimum amount of work is implied or guaranteed, and no appropriation is made as a result of this action. Individual task orders will vary but in no case will exceed the approved contract amounts.

FISCAL IMPACT

Since this set of on-call contracts represents a proactive plan to bring on resources that are projected to be needed, specific projects, studies, and associated funding sources are not yet identified. Overall these services will be needed for delivery of projects citywide funded by Federal and State sources, such as Bridge Highway Program (BHP), Active Transportation Program (ATP), Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP), and various other grant sources. The approval of this resolution will not result in additional appropriation of funds. Funds will be identified prior to execution of each task order.

PUBLIC OUTREACH / INTEREST

In June 2018, OakDOT reached out to various local, ethnic, minority, and disadvantaged communities in Oakland, and encouraged them to participate in the RFQ process. This included contacting the Oakland African American Chamber of Commerce, National Organization of Minority Architects (SF-NOMA), Bay Area Black Professional Organizations, Hispanic Engineers Builders and Contractors of California, and the Regional Technical Training Center (RTTC). Outreach materials are provided in **Attachment B**. Additionally, staff provided notice to labor representatives, per the terms and conditions of the current Memorandums of Understanding with Local 21, Service Employees' International Union - Local 1021 (SEIU), and International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers (IBEW) prior to the formal issuance of the RFQ.

A legal advertisement for the RFQ was posted on June 15, 2018. The RFQ was formally advertised in a total of eleven (11) newspapers in various languages to reach as many local firms as possible. This included the San Francisco Chronicle, East Bay Times, Oakland Post, East Bay Express, World Journal, El Mundo, La Opinion Del La Bahia, Vision Hispana, Sing Tao, The Korea Times, and Nhat Bao Cali Today. The City's web-based procurement system iSupplier and CIPlist.com were utilized for distribution of the RFQ with documents available free of charge online.

COORDINATION

This report and legislation have been reviewed by the Office of the City Attorney and the Budget Bureau. The Contracts and Compliance Division of the City Administrator's Office provided the compliance analysis of firms.

PAST PERFORMANCE, EVALUATION AND FOLLOW-UP

Below is a summary of the selected firms' previous experience as consultants for the City of Oakland:

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 Biggs Cardosa Associates, Inc. – This firm currently holds a contract with the City to perform engineering services and is performing in a satisfactory manner.

- COWI North America, Inc. This firm has not held a contract with the City to perform engineering services.
- ARUP This firm currently holds a contract with the City to perform engineering services and is performing in a satisfactory manner.

SUSTAINABLE OPPORTUNITIES

Economic: The contracts will generate business tax, sales tax, and other revenues for the City by those firms who work on the projects. Local residents and businesses will most likely be utilized in the construction of many of these projects and will benefit directly. Also, projects under this contract will improve bridge seismic reliability, ensuring continued safe use of the structures and improving the probability the bridge will remain functional following a seismic event, which is critical to rapid recovery. Bridge rehabilitation also reduces long-term maintenance costs.

Environmental: The contractor for the projects under these contracts will be required to make every effort to reuse clean fill materials and use recyclable concrete product. The project will also implement the Best Management Practices for the protection of storm water runoff during construction to prevent pollutants from entering the storm drain systems.

Social Equity: Projects completed under these contracts will provide safe structures and will be designed in accordance with latest codes and regulations. Consultants will be required to design City improvements in compliance with the physical access requirements of applicable accessibility codes and the Americans with Disabilities Act. Furthermore, bridge seismic retrofit projects will enhance pedestrian and vehicular safety, thereby benefiting all Oakland residents.

At the request of the Department of Transportation, the designated Compliance Officer conducted an availability analysis of the DBE market to determine the specific DBE goal for this federally funded project. The DBE goal for this project is 33%.

Contracts & Compliance conducted a compliance analysis of six (6) proposals submitted to the City in response to the above referenced RFP. Below are the results of the compliance evaluations for the minimum 33% Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) participation goal, and Equal Benefits Ordinance (EBO).

COMPLIANCE OFFICER NOTES:

JMEC's proposal produced the highest DBE participation at 75%. While DBE projects do not require local participation, Biggs Cardosa's proposed 83% L/SLBE participation and Wood Rodgers proposed the highest SLBE participation at 69%. RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY ADMINISTRATOR OR DESIGNEE TO EXECUTE PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENTS FOR ON-CALL STRUCTURAL ENGINEERING SERVICES SUPPORTING FEDERAL PROJECTS WITH THREE FIRMS FOR TWO MILLION DOLLARS (\$2,000,000.00) EACH TO BIGGS CARDOSA ASSOCIATES, INC.; COWI NORTH AMERICA, INC.; AND ARUP

WHEREAS, on-call structural engineering services are needed to assist the Department of Transportation in delivering federally funded capital improvement projects expeditiously in response to the influx of grant funding; and

WHEREAS, the City's current staffing capacity is insufficient to deliver much needed federally funded capital improvement projects; and

WHEREAS, on-call professional services provide structural engineering services to support capital improvement projects; and

WHEREAS, on June 15, 2018, the City issued a Request for Qualifications (RFQ) for On-Call Structural Engineering Services for federally funded projects, and six (6) firms submitted Statement of Qualifications (SOQ); and

WHEREAS, all firms met or exceeded the City's Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) goal of 33.00% participation and four (4) firms are Equal Benefits Ordinance (EBO) compliant; and

WHEREAS, three (3) firms have been selected for recommendation to be awarded with professional services agreements to provide on-call structural engineering services for federally funded projects; and

WHEREAS, on-call structural engineering services will be funded through various individual federal projects and funds will be identified prior to the performance of the on-call services; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds that the services provided pursuant to the agreements authorized hereunder are of a professional, scientific, or technical nature and are temporary in nature; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds that the agreements shall not result in the loss of employment or salary by any person having permanent status in the competitive services; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the City Council authorizes the City Administrator or designee to execute professional services agreements for on-call structural engineering services supporting federal projects to three (3) firms for two million dollars (\$2,000,000.00) each to Biggs Cardosa Associates, Inc.; COWI North America, Inc.; And ARUP; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the terms of each agreement shall be executed for a three (3) year duration; and be it
