#### RECOMMENDATION

Staff Recommends Adoption Of An Ordinance Amending Ordinance No. 13497 C.M.S. (The Fiscal Year (FY) 2018-19 Master Fee Schedule, Or "MFS"), To Establish, Modify And Delete Fees And Penalties Assessed By Offices, Departments, Bureaus, And Agencies Of The City Of Oakland, Referenced Herein.

#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

The Fiscal Year (FY) 2019-20 MFS documents the fees and charges accruing to the City's General Purpose Fund ("GPF") and selected fees within other funds. The fees proposed in this document are assumed in the revenue estimates contained in the FY 2019-20 Budget. Cumulative departmental fees and charges for FY 2019-20 are projected to generate a net increase in revenue above the FY 2019-20 level of approximately \$4,076,298 for the GPF (1010) and for non-GPFs, \$280,000 for the Mandatory Garbage Fund (1700) and \$250,000 for the Multipurpose Reserve Fund (1750). The net increase from FY 2019-20 reflects growth in fee revenue collected by several departments, such as, Department of Transportation, Finance Department, Oakland Fire Department, Oakland Public Library, Human Services Department, Contract & Compliance Department, and Oakland Animal Services Department.

In developing the FY 2019-20 fee structure, staff was guided primarily by the requirements of Proposition 26, and City Council's policy direction to strive for 100 percent cost recovery for most fee-related programs. During the budget development process, all fee programs were reviewed to ensure that the amounts being assessed would remain comparable in the market, would not be too cost prohibitive, and would maintain current levels of cost recovery. Doing so will allow departments to continue to provide valuable programs and services to the community. The attachments included in this report contain detailed analysis and documentation by the responsible department of the proposed fees and estimated costs for the services for which the fees are assessed.

A detailed explanation of department fees and findings are found in the Director Department Narratives and presented in *Attachment A.* 

#### **BACKGROUND / LEGISLATIVE HISTORY**

The proposed ordinance shows proposed changes to the MFS for FY 2019-20. In most cases, changes to fees are required to offset changes in costs related to the provision of services for which fees are assessed. The changes in fees (added or modified) are intended to meet the requirements of Proposition 26. In areas where fee comparisons are applicable, the City's fees and charges are similar to those of other neighboring jurisdictions.

The amendments proposed in FY 2019-20 MFS include:

- Increases to existing fees to recover the reasonable cost of providing the service;
- Establish fees for services proposed in the FY 2019-20 Proposed Budget or as mandated by State or regional legislation;
- Decrease to existing fees; and
- Add or delete fees.

Following final adoption of the amendments, the revised fees and new proposed fees by the City Administrator's Office, Department of Transportation, Economic & Workforce Development, Oakland Parks, Recreation & Youth Development Department, Oakland Public Works, Finance Department, Oakland Fire Department, the Office of the City Attorney, Oakland Public Library, Human Services Department, Contract & Compliance Department, and Oakland Animal Services Department, ("the Departments") will become effective July 1, 2019.

#### **ANALYSIS AND POLICY ALTERNATIVES**

City departments calculated fees at full cost, taking into account all salary, fringe benefits, overhead, and retirement, to determine the actual costs. Departments have confirmed in the individual departmental submissions, attached hereto, that the newly proposed fees and changes to existing fees comply with Proposition 26. To meet this requirement, each of the Departments submitted fee analyses to document findings and fee calculations for all fees proposed. Note: The Planning and Building Department recently conducted a comprehensive fee analysis of department fees with MGT of America. Planning and Building Department requires additional time to examine the results of the analysis and will present fees to the City Council for review and approval at a later date. As such, Planning and Building Department fees are not incorporated in this FY 2019-20 MFS update.

#### FISCAL IMPACT

The revenues anticipated from fees are assumed in the FY 2019-20 Proposed Budget, and any modifications to the fee proposal may impact budget balancing. Anticipated revenue will help offset costs to provide services for which the fees are assessed, with no net gain to the City's overall budget. *Table 1* below shows the fiscal impact to the General Purpose Fund totaling \$4,076.298, and non-general purpose funds are shown in *Table 2* below totaling \$530,000.

#### RECOMMENDATION

The City Administrator's Office (CAO) recommends that the City Council adopt its proposed adjustments for the FY 2019-2020 Master Fee Schedule.

#### **ANALYSIS**

The CAO reviewed its fees to determine at what level the fees would be full cost recovery. For special activity permit and nuisance abatement fees, the personnel costs were determined by reviewing the classifications involved in the activity, plus the current retirement, fringe and applicable overhead rates were applied based on an hourly rate. The average amount of time required to provide the service was estimated by staff. Additionally, staff incorporated any related printing and supply costs.

Most of the fee adjustments for FY 2019-20 are modest increases to reflect COLA increases and any new classifications for city staff. However, with respect to the charitable solicitation and amplified sound permit fees, staff recommends maintaining them at existing rates to encourage compliance. The proposed fee schedule also includes the hourly rate for new municipal code enforcement officer staff.

With respect to cannabis fees, OMC 5.80 and 5.81 exempt equity applicants from all City application and permitting fees.

#### **FISCAL IMPACT**

The fiscal impact from these fee changes is expected to be minimal due to the marginal nature of the proposed changes. These fees are recovered to the General Purpose Fund (1010).

The DOT proposes master fee changes for FY 2019-20, including modifications and additions of the current assessed fees in compliance with the state's voter-approved Proposition 26.

The amendments proposed in FY 2019-20 MFS include:

- Increases to existing fees to cover the cost of providing the service, and including the approved COLA increase in FY2018-19.
- Fees for the new services mandated by the state or regional legislation;
- Elimination of fees for services no longer provided; and
- Re-alignment of fees to market rate in accordance with other entities or municipalities.

Below are the key highlights and rationale for the amendments proposed in FY 2019-20:

**General Fee Increase** - Where applicable, all fees were increased to reflect the 1% COLA on personnel costs, fringe benefits, retirement and other personnel costs, per AI 1303, and approved by the City Council.

**Off-Street Parking Rate Changes:** Rates for various City-owned parking garages are updated to reflect garages that have been closed, or newly opened for business. They are also adjusted to reflect operator recommended market rates.

**Survey Fees:** A few line items have been added for services currently available through billing of hourly rates. By bundling into discrete services, we can provide clearer information to the public of the services we provide.

Scooter Fees: Added fees related to the Scooter Sharing Program as approved by City Council in October 2018.

**Overall Fiscal Impact:** The revenues from new fees are included in the FY 2019-21 Policy Budget proposal and any modifications to the fee proposal may impact budget balancing. Anticipated revenue from COLA adjustments will offset costs to provide services for which the To: Sabrina B. Landreth Subject: DOT MFS Amendments Date: March 1, 2019

fees are charged, with no net gain to the City's overall budget. Our Master fee were previously based on overhead rates for Public Works. Since DOT was created 2 years ago, DOT's overhead rate was 30% higher than OPW. For rate increases for the last 2 years were based on straight line rate of 4% and 9% for FY 2018 & FY 2019 respectively across the all city departments. The increase did not take into account for the overhead rate increase for DOT. Our calculation is actually a 'catch-up' for cost recovery. Funds will be impacted as follows:

Fund 1010 General Purpose Fund – Will result in preliminary projected revenue increase of approximately \$100,000

Fund 1750 Multipurpose Reserve - Will result in preliminary projected revenue increase of approximately \$250,000 for proposed fee increase in market rate for parking garages

Fund 2415 Development service fund – Service volume is difficult to project because this service is on demand basis. All revenues are cost based

FY 2019-20 Master Fee Schedule for Economic & Workforce Development Department (EWDD)

Attached is the Proposed FY 2019-20 Master Fee Schedule (MFS) for the Economic & Workforce Development Department (EWDD) consisting of Real Estate, Public Art and Film fees.

The proposed amendments to the Real Estate fees are due to increased staff costs. Staff costs were calculated using 100% salary + 120.91% EWDD fringe, pursuant to Al 1303 Appendix A, + 39.10% EWDD Central Services Overhead (CSO). Previously, the clerical role in Real Estate was handled by an Administrative Analyst II, but will be covered by an Account Clerk III in FY 2019-20. Because of this change, the staff time required for each position in Real Estate has been reallocated.

Public Art fees are proposed to increase to full cost recovery for staff time of a sole Program Analyst III, including the Cost of Living Increase (COLA), fringe and CSO rates. Previously, the duties had been shared between a Program Analyst II and a Program Analyst III.

The new Public Art fee covers staff time to review proposals submitted by project applicants to comply with Oakland Municipal Code (OMC) 15.78, and is based on staff time including the COLA, fringe and CSO rates. It replaces the fee previously authorized under Public Art Program Section. A.1.

Subject: EWD Master Fee Schedule Amendments Date: April 9, 2019

OMC Chapter 5.24, Filming Permits, requires a permit to conduct filming activities within the City. The film fees cover the cost of processing the film permit applications. Because film fees have not been raised in over 15 years, some of the proposed fee increases are as high as 100% for cost recovery of staff time including the COLA and fringe rates. The Special Events Coordinator staff costs are calculated at 100% salary and 120.91% EWDD fringe, pursuant to AI 1303 Appendix A. The position is funded by General Purpose Fund 1010 and is not subject to overhead.

The purpose of the memorandum is to provide Oakland Parks, Recreation and Youth Development's (OPRYD's) proposed changes to Master Fee Schedule.

#### Oakland Parks, Recreation and Youth Development (OPRYD)

Proposed fee increases for OPRYD's partners operating City facilities:

- Oakland Children's Fairyland is proposing a fee increase for Admissions. The increased fees are intended to help offset cost increases in operations. The Children's Fairyland Board has taken the decision to increase admissions by \$2/adult/child from \$10 to \$12, and \$5 to \$6 for children with a school group (weekday).
- Chabot Golf Course is proposing to amend fees for Golf Course General Admission for residents and non-residents to allow for wage increases and to remain competitive with average 18-hole and large bucket rates. In addition, there are proposed increases to the rental of the Clubroom to cover the cost of operations.
- Feather River Camp is proposing to amend fees to cover the cost to operate the camp grounds.
- Metropolitan Golf is proposing to amend fees for Golf Course General Admission for residents and non-residents to allow for wage increases.

OPRYD proposes to amend existing fees and introduce new fees as follows:

- Rental Facilities: Staff is proposing a change to the minimum weekend reservation hours, from 2-hours to 4-hours at Recreation Centers and Studio One. Due to increases in staff costs, staff is also proposing increase to the hourly rental rate for non-profit organizations to reserve a meeting room at Recreation Centers.
- Aquatics Boating Program is proposing to introduce a new fee for the rental of the gated hoist enclosure (boating events only) at Lake Merritt Boating Center (LMBC). Boating staff is also proposing to add a new fee to recover staff and cleaning costs for restroom access at the Jack London Aquatic Center (JLAC).
- Camps Staff is proposing to increase the Recreation Day Camps & Overnight Camps maximum rate from \$350 to \$400 to accommodate increases to personnel costs.
- Tennis Programs Staff is proposing deleting fees that are no longer utilized and increasing fees for use of the Club House to include the use of Tennis Courts for events.

Because the fees are new or changing, the fiscal impact (revenues collected) is not certain.

The City of Oakland Public Work Department (OPW) proposes Master Fee Schedule (MFS) amendments for FY 2019-20, including modifications and additions of the current assessed fees in compliance with the state's voter-approved Proposition 26.

The amendments proposed in FY 2019-20 MFS include:

- Increases to existing fees to cover the cost of providing the service, and including the approved COLA increase in FY18-19;
- Fees for the new services mandated by state or regional legislation;
- Elimination of fees for services no longer provided; and
- Re-alignment of fees to market rate in accordance with other entities or municipalities.

Below are the key highlights and rationale for amendments proposed in FY 2019-20:

General Fee Increase - Where applicable, all fees were increased to reflect the FY 2018-19 adopted 1% increase in COLA on personnel costs, plus proposed increases in fringe benefits, retirement and other personnel costs, per AI 1303, in FY 2019-20.

**Environmental Enforcement Fees** – Fees are reinstated to the MFS with the re-establishment of the Environmental Enforcement Unit (formerly the Litter Enforcement Unit), with the aim to reimburse the City actual staff costs associated with litter/illegal dumping investigation and enforcement. Fee elements are in accordance with the Oakland Municipal Code's (OMC's) cost of clean-up.

#### **RECOMMENDATION**

The Finance Department recommends the City Council approve proposed changes to the FY 2019-20 Master Fee Schedule ("MFS"), which include new fees and to increase existing fees to recover the reasonable cost of providing the service.

#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

The Finance Department has analyzed its fees and proposes to revise fees for the FY 2019-20 MFS Update. The Finance Department has identified the need to recover costs for providing new services, to increase fees due to cost increases associated with providing services, and to include a new fee for the Cannabis Administrative Processing Fee to recover costs to manage the processing of cannabis business accounts. Existing fees need to recover employee wage increases as a result of the recent MOU approvals for cost of living adjustments ("COLA") and the increase cost of employee benefits.

The Finance Department proposes to introduce one new fee to recover costs for providing services of processing and administrating the management of cannabis payments in the City of Oakland. The proposed fee is cost recovery and is reasonable and apportioned in the City's efforts to recover oversight payment costs of the cannabis industry within the City of Oakland. The fiscal impact of the proposed fee request is not known at this time as the industry is developing and all fees will be allocated to the General-Purpose Fund (1010).

#### ANALYSIS

As mentioned above, the Finance Department reviewed its fees in order to determine at what level the fees would be full cost recovery. Most changes to the MFS offset increased costs related to the provision of services for which fees are charged. Staff analyzed and documented that the proposed fees or charges within the MFS for FY 2019-20 are no more than necessary to cover the reasonable costs of the activity or service being provided, and that the manner in which those costs are allocated to the payer bears a fair or reasonable relationship to the payer's burden

on, or benefits received from, the activity of service. The changes in fees (added or modified) are intended to meet the requirement of Proposition 26.

#### **FINDINGS**

The Finance Department proposes modifying fees under its jurisdiction in an effort to recover those costs directly related to providing a service, processing applications or declarations and collection efforts. The result of the department fee analysis support the need to introduce new fees and penalties in an effort to recover costs. The Finance Department has identified the following fees to be included in the Master Fee Schedule to close the gap towards full cost recovery.

#### The Finance Department recommendations for the FY 2019-20 MFS Update:

- City Subscription Fee for Mandatory Garbage as allowed by Oakland Municipal Code Section 8.28.240 increase of Basic Fee increase of \$20.00, or 21%, to \$116.00.
- Administrative Fee for Promissory Notes increase of \$5.00, or 5.26%, to \$125.00.
- Promissory Note Maintenance Fee increase of \$5.00, or 5.26%, to \$100.00.
- *Recordation and Technology Fee increase of \$1.00, or 33.33%, to \$4.00.*
- Special Event Permit Fee increase of \$10.00, or 12.50%, to \$90.00.
- Notice of Violation Fee Non-Procurement of Business Certificate increase of \$55.00, or 55%, to \$155.00.
- Administrative cost recovery as allowed by Oakland Municipal Code Section 4.20.070 increase of \$25.00, or 20%, to \$150.00.
- Administrative cost recovery as allowed by Oakland Municipal Code Section 5.04.260 increase of \$25.00, or 20%, to \$150.00.
- Citywide Lien Administrative Fee increase of \$25.00, or 20%, to \$150.00.

#### **City Subscription Fee for Mandatory Garbage:**

Due to the increase cost of managing the delinquent and non-payment of garbage invoices, the Administrative Fee or Subscription Administrative Service Charge as allowed by Oakland Municipal Code Section 8.28.240 to increase of the Basic Fee to recover the cost of managing the program. This is a non-General Purpose Fund, as such, Fund 1700 (Mandatory Garbage) is a self-supporting fund in which all expenses are incorporated in the Subscription Administrative Service Charge. The subscription fee for Mandatory Garbage will increase from \$96.00 to \$116.00, or 20%.

#### **Administrative Fee for Promissory Notes:**

The increase of this fee is due to the increase in the COLA and O&M costs.

#### **Promissory Note Maintenance Fee:**

The increase is due to the increase of labor costs and O&M costs.

#### **Recordation and Technology Fee:**

The increase of this fee is to recover system enhancements to existing systems.

#### **Special Event Permit Fee:**

Due to the increase of staff time and support costs to conduct research has resulted in the need to increase the permit fee by \$10.00 to a cost of \$90.00. The importance of this permit is to research if a business can operate in the City of Oakland and to record the business is conducting business within the City of Oakland.

#### Notice of Violation:

This fee is imposed on those businesses that are not in compliance to the City of Oakland Business Tax Ordinance. Upon discovery that a business does not have a valid certificate, the Notice of Violation is issued to the non-compliant business. The Notice of Violation Fee is proposed to increase from \$100.00 to \$155.00 to both recover the increased labor costs and the cost of equipment used in the process to identify non-compliant businesses.

#### **Citywide Liens (Administration Services for all City Lien Processing):**

Administrative costs to process and administer liens to recover monies owed to the City has increased due to wage increases and overhead support costs. This fee has been calculated in conjunction with the Planning and Building Department and the Finance Department. This fee will be used as the benchmark fee for processing city liens. This fee is proposed to increase from \$125.00 to \$150.00, or 20%.

#### FISCAL IMPACT

All proposed new fees will be introduced in the Schedule this fiscal year, as such revenues derived from new fees are undetermined at this time. The proposed increase of the Recordation and Technology fee will result in approximately \$60,000 and for the Special Event Permit approximately \$10,000, processing Citywide Lien Demands in the amount of \$50,000 (Fund 1010), processing Notice of Violation in the amount of approximately \$2,750 for a total increase in the General-Purpose Fund of \$122,750.00.

The City Subscription Fee for the administration of the Mandatory Garbage will increase from \$96.00 to \$116.00, or 20% for an approximate total fiscal impact of \$280,000, which will be recovered in the Mandatory Garbage Fund (1700).

#### **RECOMMENDATION**

The Oakland Fire Department (OFD), Fire Prevention Bureau (FPB) recommends the City Council approve proposed changes to the FY 2019-20 Master Fee Schedule (MFS), which include new fees to recover the reasonable cost of providing services.

#### EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The proposed FY 2019-20 MFS reflects an increase in fees to all the personnel-based services, in accordance with Proposition 26 cost recovery guidelines. Such fees include plan review for new construction and tenant improvement, and re-models to existing structures; routine field inspections associated with all new construction, California state mandated facilities, annual operational permits, special event permits, and hazardous materials. The increase in all respective fees will ensure all services achieve adequate cost recovery levels to minimize the impact to the general-purpose fund (1010).

Specific services detailed above include:

- Operational Permits: The California Fire Code requires the issuance of annual operational permits to those businesses conducting activities which are regulated through the Authority Housing Jurisdiction (AHJ). Issuing the annual operational permits requires the OFD to perform tasks associated with research of the California Fire Code, previous compliance records, and current ownership, as well as, the approval and generation of the actual permits.
- Plan Review/Construction Permits: The California Fire Code requires the issuance of construction and/or installation permits to those entities performing construction and/or installation regulated through the AHJ. The California Fire Code specifies that construction and/or installation permits are to be issued under defined conditions, and only after plans submitted have been reviewed and approved by the AHJ.
- Inspections: The California Fire Code authorizes the AHJ to conduct routine inspections as deemed necessary, to determine compliance with the provisions of the fire code for all regulated annual occupancies and/or construction sites. Further it indicates that permits, and/or

certificates of compliance shall not be issued to those occupancies and/or construction sites requiring them until all outstanding violations have been corrected. Other than the proposed increase to general inspections and re-inspections, the most significant percentage increases in the inspections category are those related to new construction, as this category has shown a significant increase in activity during the last couple of years.

#### ANALYSIS

The FPB reviewed its fees to determine at what level the fees would be fully cost recoverable. Most changes to the MFS offset increased costs related to the provision of services for which fees are charged. Staff analyzed and documented that the proposed fees or charges within the MFS for FY 2019-20 are no more than necessary to cover the reasonable costs of the activity or service being provided, and that the way those costs are allocated to the payer bears a fair or reasonable relationship to the payer's burden on, or benefits received from, the activity of service. The changes in fees (added or modified) are intended to meet the requirement of Proposition 26.

#### **FINDINGS**

The FPB proposes modifying fees under its jurisdiction in comportment with the 2016 California Fire Code to recover those costs directly related to providing a service. The result of the department fee analysis supports the need to introduce new fees to recover costs. FPB has identified the following fees to be included in the Master Fee Schedule to close the gap towards full cost recovery.

#### FISCAL IMPACT

Under the direction of the Fire Marshal, the Fire Prevention Bureau (FPB) provides overall fire code regulatory compliance functions for the City of Oakland. The FPB serves to directly benefit the health and life safety/well-being of the entire community through the following:

- Comprehensive fire protection engineering review
- Approval of new construction and tenant improvement plans for fire and life safety
- Comprehensive inspection and enforcement of the California Fire Code.

Annual inspection programs include: State-mandated and operational permit inspections conducted by FPB Code Inspectors, with non-permitted and multi-unit residential inspections performed by engine company personnel. The FPB also directly manages hazardous building referrals from engine companies for a thorough compliance enforcement follow-up, and coordinates fire cause investigations with three (3) sworn Investigators. Vegetation Management inspections in the Very High Fire Danger zones of Oakland Hills are conducted by FPB suppression district Inspectors, and engine company personnel. The FPB has a very well regarded Public Fire Education Program (ages pre-school to seniors) that reaches thousands of citizens annually.

The total increase in Revenue and Expenditures is estimated at approximately \$2,666,360. These revenue estimates are limited to cost recovery in compliance with California Proposition 26.

The Oakland City Attorney's Office is not revenue generating; however, the hourly rates in the Master Fee Schedule are used when preparing court documents to recover money from opposing parties such as sanctions, settlements, statutorily mandated attorney's fees, etc.

The Master Fee Schedule hourly rates are for billable staff only (Attorneys, Paralegals, and the Claims Investigator). The billing rate for the staff is calculated using the position's hourly rate (at step 5 or top or range), adding the annual fringe benefits rate, Office overhead rate, and the Post-employment (OPEB) rate. Our Office Overhead rate includes the cost of non-billing staff (management, administrative and legal secretarial staff) and operating costs (utilities, supplies, cost of the City's financial services).

The proposed FY 19-20 (Attachment 1) fees were calculated by using the current fees and adding the 1% Cost of Living Adjustment (COLA), authorized by the City Council. Our Office is not requesting any additional fee revisions at this time.

#### EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Oakland Public Library seeks approval to change the Master Fee Schedule for Fiscal Year 2019-2020. Minor edits and obsolete charges are noted in the attached spreadsheet under "Justification for Fee Change" to explain typos or updates to library services that have negligible fiscal impact.

The significant request is to eliminate an institutional barrier to library use, namely overdue fines for library materials that are returned past the due date.

Nationwide, libraries are recognizing that overdue fines create unnecessary and inequitable barriers to resources and many have gone "fine-free". Currently, Oakland Public Library does not charge overdue fines for youth, but fiscal penalties remain for adults. Our library overdue fines disproportionately impact communities of color, which in Oakland are the most likely to be living below the federal poverty level, to be homeless, and to lack high speed internet access, according to the 2018 Oakland Equity Indicators Report.

#### BACKGROUND

The City Council has oversight over library fines through the Master Fee Schedule. Overdue fines appear on a patron's account after an item has been returned past the due date. When fines and/or fees reach a cumulative total of \$50, a library patron is not allowed to borrow materials until the amount is paid to less than \$50.

In March, 2017, with City Council approval, the Library eliminated overdue fines for youth patrons with the following impacts:

- Number of Juvenile and Teen library cardholders increased by 10,141, or 17%
- Circulation of Juvenile and Teen materials increased by 98,627 items, or 12%
- No impact to the rate of unreturned items

The library now seeks to extend the elimination of overdue fines to adults.

#### ANALYSIS AND POLICY ALTERNATIVES

The proposed ordinance to modify Oakland Public Library fines will promote equity and reduce a barrier that disproportionately harms communities of color and households with incomes below the median.

Overdue fines negatively affect patrons who can least afford the fine and are not an effective incentive to returning library materials. For those who can afford the fines, paying a small late fee is no problem, so the fines are not a strong incentive. On the other hand, for those with limited financial means, they commonly stop using the Library rather than pay what they can't afford.

Users are billed a replacement fee for items not returned 30 days past the due date. The fee is excused when the item is returned. This is the most effective way to ensure residents responsibly return library materials.

It is abundantly clear that overdue fines disproportionately impact communities of color. The library analyzed impacts using the zip code framework in the Oakland Equity Indicators report, comparing zip codes in which more than 60% of the population is non-White and zip codes in which more than 60% of the population is White (based on American Community Survey 5-year estimates, 2012-2016).

In this analysis, an adult in a predominantly non-White zip code in Oakland, compared to an adult in a predominantly White zip code in Oakland, is:

- 5% more likely to have fines exceeding \$50 dollars, resulting in a blocked record
- 26% more likely to owe library fines
- 24% more likely to have a library card
- 45% less likely to use their card (based on average total checkout)

According to the Oakland Equity Indicators report, these adults are also the most likely to be living below the federal poverty level, to be homeless, and to lack high speed internet access (which the library can provide through a library card).

Removing overdue fines for adults in Oakland will reduce economic barriers to the free public library resources for our neediest communities. Removing overdue fines for all ages have proven in other library systems to result in:

- Increase in overall use of library materials
- No increase in unreturned materials
- Neutral fiscal impact

In addition, eliminating overdue fines increases staff capacity to directly serve the needs of the public, as it frees staff from monetary transactions. The Library estimates that an average of \$200,000 in staff time is spent annually in fine negotiations, collections and deposits.

Nationwide, libraries are removing overdue fines. In the Bay Area alone, Berkeley Public Library went fine free in July 2018, Contra Costa County Libraries and San Mateo Public Libraries in January 2019, and others are expected to follow suit in 2019. When St. Paul, Minnesota libraries went fine free in January 2019, their mayor Melvin Carter noted in an interview with KARE Channel 11 that overdue fines "don't make people bring books back, they make people stay away from the library." Oakland Public Library staff affirm this, noting that even the potential of a fine is a deterrent to some parents signing up for a library card for their children or themselves.

To achieve these positive impacts for Oakland residents, the attached proposed adjustments to the master fee schedule eliminate overdue fines for most materials, and significantly reduce fines

for tools. We have proposed compacting categories of tools subject to fines, and reducing fines for high-value tools from 50%-75%.

#### **FISCAL IMPACT**

In FY 2017-18 the library collected \$77,600 in overdue fines which are deposited to the General Purpose Fund (Fund 1010). However, as noted above, it costs the City more than twice that amount in staff time to collect that income.

#### **RECOMMENDATION**

The Human Services Department (HSD) recommends the City Council approve proposed changes to the FY 2019-20 Master Fee Schedule (MFS), which include new fees and to increase existing fees to recover the reasonable cost of providing the service.

#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

HSD has analyzed its fees and proposes to revise fees for the FY 2019-20 MFS Update. HSD has identified the need to recover costs for providing new services, to increase fees due to cost increases associated with providing services or for the direct benefit of Senior Center membership. Existing fees need to recover employee wage increases to add a Permanent Part-Time Custodian (PPTC) to improve staffing and customer service for the rental program. HSD proposes to introduce a new fee for Case Management services to allow entities who do not qualify for this program under Medi-Cal rules to purchase the service. In addition, HSD Downtown Oakland Senior Center Advisory Council is requesting an increase to parking fees to pay for additional security (Attachment; DOSC Advisory Minutes). The proposed fees are cost recovery and are reasonable and apportioned in compliance with Proposition 26. The fiscal impact of the proposed fee request s other than the regulatory mandate will recover approximately \$25,000 in rental fees and \$4,000 in parking fees to be recovered in the General-Purpose Fund (1010).

#### ANALYSIS

The result of the department fee analysis support the need to increase or introduce new fees in an effort to recover costs. HSD has identified the following fees to be included in the Master Fee Schedule to close the gap towards full cost recovery.

#### HSD recommendations for the FY 2019-20 MFS Update:

- Rental Fee Set-Up and Take-Down (four Senior Centers) Fee Increase of \$50.00.
- Case Management Fee (Fee for Services, Non-MediCal), \$350 Month
- Case Management Fee (Fee for Services, Institutions), \$500 Month
- Downtown Oakland Senior Center Parking Sticker Fee Increase of \$5.00.

### Fee for Senior Center rental including set-up and take-down

HSD reviewed its rental fees for use of the Senior Centers to determine a relatively fixed revenue stream to fund consistent staffing for events and a central contact person for renters during hours outside normal operational hours. An increase to the Rental Fee Set-Up and Take-Down from \$150 to \$200 is needed to recover the costs for a permanent-part time single point of contact custodian during evening and weekend rentals.

#### **Case Management Fee**

Human Services Department provides case management services to individuals that are eligible for Medi-Cal reimbursement. The City does not charge for this service because it receives a Medi-cal reimbursement. The City is proposing to introduce a new fee to cover the cost of providing a similar case management service to non medi-cal eligible clients. Case Manager II staff positions are required by the City to open cases and assist fragile seniors. The fully burdened cost for a Case Manager II at Step 5 is \$100 per hour. Case Managers interact with client cases weekly for at least an hour. The \$350 per month fee will pay for the Case Manager's time. The Case Management fee for Healthcare Institutions of \$500 is based on the additional time Case Managers will spend providing documentation required by the institutions.

## **Senior Center Parking Fees**

The Senior Center parking fees are for the purpose of increasing security guard presence during hours of regular operation and special events. DOSC sells approximately 800 parking permits per year so the annual revenue increase of \$5.00 (from \$3.00 to \$8.00) will result in \$4,000 in revenue to pay for over 225 hours of security guard services for seniors. The \$8.00 annual parking fee that will be paid by Senior Center members is still well below market rate and the funds will provide all Seniors who attend the Center with additional security

Staff analyzed and documented that the proposed fees or charges within the MFS for FY 2018are intended to meet the requirement of Proposition 26.

#### FISCAL IMPACT

All proposed new fees will be introduced in the Schedule this fiscal year, as such revenues derived from new fees is undetermined at this time. The proposed increase of the senior center rental fee will result in approximately \$25,000. We do not know the fiscal impact of the Case Management Fees because they are new. he parking fee increase will generate an estimated \$4,000 per year that will be used to pay for additional security guard services at the Downtown Oakland Senior Center.

### **RECOMMENDATION**

The City Administrator's Office, Contracts and Compliance Division (CCD) recommends the City Council approve proposed changes to the FY 2019-20 Master Fee Schedule ("MFS"), which include new fees to recover the reasonable cost of providing services, and to delete obsolete fees.

#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

The CCD has analyzed its fees and proposes to revise fees for the FY 19-20 MFS Update. The CCD has identified the need to recover costs for providing existing services, and to institute more aggressive collection of fees due and unpaid. The CCD proposes to introduce a new fee to recover costs for providing services associated with processing payments for the LCP Tracker Usage fee and to add a Minimum Wage and Labor Standards Enforcement Fee to capture costs associated with analysis of wages paid to hotel workers and non-hotel workers per Measure Z. The fiscal impact of the proposed fee request will be recovered in the General-Purpose Fund (1010).

#### ANALYSIS

As mentioned above, the CCD reviewed its fees to determine at what level the fees would be full cost recovery. Most changes to the MFS offset increased costs related to the provision of services for which fees are charged. The changes in fees (added or modified) are intended to meet the requirement of Proposition 26.

#### FINDINGS

CCD has identified the following fees to be included in the Master Fee Schedule to close the gap towards full cost recovery.

#### The CCD recommendations for the FY 2019/20 MFS Update:

- Staff fee for processing LCP Tracker Usage Fee payments \$35.00 each transaction
- Minimum Wage & Labor Standards Enforcement fee \$23.00 annually

#### **Certified Payroll Tracking Usage Processing Fee**

State prevailing wage rates apply to all public works contracts as set forth in Labor Code Sections 1720, 1720.2, 1720.3, 1720.4, and 1771. Workers employed on public improvement projects in California that use public funds are paid the prevailing wage, which is the basic hourly rate most workers in a craft or classification earn. The prevailing wage requirement is monitored and enforced by the CCD. The CCD maintains a subscription to LCP Tracker, a labor compliance software to track the payment of prevailing wages on City funded construction projects. The existing LCP Tracker Usage fee is a monthly fee paid by the contractor for the use of the software. The proposed new LCP Tracker Usage Payment Processing fee will recover staff costs to process the contractor payments received for software usage..

#### Minimum Wage and Labor Standards Enforcement Fee

Oakland's voter-enacted ballot measures, Measure FF and Measure Z, establish enforcement of minimum wage and employment standards. Measure FF provides annual increases to Oakland's Minimum Wage based on the local Consumer Price Index (CPI), requires that employers in Oakland provide paid sick leave to their employees, and requires that hospitality employers who collect service charges from customers pay all service charges to their hospitality workers. Measure Z provides workplace protections and minimum hourly wages of \$15 with benefits or \$20 without benefits, increasing annually with inflation, for employees of Oakland hotels with 50 or more guest rooms. This proposed new regulatory fee recovers staffing, education, and other administrative costs around enforcement of these minimum wage and labor measures

### FISCAL IMPACT

The proposed new fee for LCP Tracker payment processing will be introduced in the Schedule this fiscal year, as such revenues derived from new fees is undetermined at this time.

The proposed new fee for Minimum Wage and Labor Standards Enforcement will bring in an estimated \$1,035,588 in FY19/20 to recover costs associated with enforcing minimum wage and labor standards imposed by Measure FF and Measure Z. These revenue estimates are limited to cost recovery in compliance with California Proposition 26.

## **RECOMMENDATION**

Oakland Animal Services ("OAS") recommends that the City Council adopt its proposed adjustments for the FY 2019-2020 Master Fee Schedule ("MFS").

## **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

OAS has analyzed its fees and proposes to revise fees for the FY 2019-20 MFS Update. OAS has identified the need to increase fees due to cost increases associated with providing services. Existing fees need to recover employee wage increases because of the recent MOU approvals for cost of living adjustments ("COLA") and the increase cost of employee benefits. Further, there has been no increase in the MFS for OAS in at least 10 years.

### ANALYSIS

As mentioned above, OAS reviewed its fees to determine at what level the fees would be full cost recovery. The proposed fees or charges within the MFS for FY 2019-20 are no more than necessary to cover the reasonable regulatory costs of the program

#### **FINDINGS**

OAS proposes modifying fees under its jurisdiction in an effort to recover the reasonable costs directly related to providing the regulatory program.

OAS looked at neighboring jurisdictions and found that the proposed fees comported with other regional organizations. These included Alameda County, City of Alameda, City of Berkeley, City & County of San Francisco. The result of the department fee analysis support the need to increase most of the fees in an effort to recover costs. OAS has identified the proposed fees changes to be included in the Master Fee Schedule to close the gap towards full cost recovery.

## FISCAL IMPACT

The fiscal impact of the proposed fee is an expected increase in licensing revenue of approximately 40% or \$45,000. As noted above, these fees have not been adjusted in at least 10 years and most of the fees will achieve parity with neighboring jurisdictions. These fees are recovered to the General Purpose Fund (1010).

ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 13497 C.M.S. (THE FISCAL YEAR 2018-19 MASTER FEE SCHEDULE, OR "MFS"), TO ESTABLISH, MODIFY AND DELETE FEES AND PENALTIES ASSESSED BY OFFICES, DEPARTMENTS, BUREAUS, AND AGENCIES OF THE CITY OF OAKLAND, REFERENCED HEREIN

WHEREAS, the City of Oakland periodically amends and updates its Master Fee Schedule to account for the various cost increases relating to municipal programs, services and activities; and

WHEREAS, the City has experienced and anticipates continuing increases in the costs to operate and maintain municipal government citywide; and

WHEREAS, City Administrator's Office, Department of Transportation, Economic & Workforce Development, Oakland Parks Recreation & Youth Development Department, Oakland Public Works, Finance Department, Oakland Fire Department, the Office of the City Attorney, Oakland Public Library, Human Services Department, Contract & Compliance Department, and Oakland Animal Services Department ("the Departments"), undertook analysis and evaluation of the revenue requirements to fund ongoing municipal services, programs and activities and the fee structure necessary to proportionately allocate the costs of providing these government services and programs; and

WHEREAS, the Agenda Report accompanying this ordinance, including Attachments A-1, A-2, A-3, A-4, A-5, A-6, A-7, A-8, A-9, A-10, A-11, and A-12, (herein "the Agenda Report") dated March 4, 2019, provided by staff of the Departments in support of the amendments to this ordinance, includes proposed fees and charges, and documentation supporting the estimated and reasonable costs for continuing to provide the various government services; and

WHEREAS, the investigations conducted by staff of the Departments reflected in the Agenda Report show that existing revenues are and will be insufficient to cover the current and projected costs of operating and maintaining identified City government activities, services and programs; and WHEREAS, the fee modifications and additions proposed by the Departments, and the facts and analysis in support thereof are identified in the Agenda Report; and

WHEREAS, the Agenda Report shows that the amounts of the proposed fees and charges will not exceed the proportional cost of service provided or benefit attributable to each fee payer; and

WHEREAS, the Agenda Report shows that the proposed fees and charges for a product, benefit or service are imposed for a specific government service, benefit or product provided directly to the payer that is not provided to those not charged, and does not exceed the reasonable costs to the City of providing the service, benefit or product; and

WHEREAS, at the Public Hearing held on \_\_\_\_\_, 2019, the Council reviewed and considered the proposed fee changes; and

WHEREAS, based upon all written and oral reports and presentations to Council, including the Agenda Report and each of the Attachments thereto, the City Council finds and determines that the proposed modifications and additions to the Master Fee Schedule set forth herein are necessary to reimburse the City for the costs of performing the various municipal and regulatory functions; now, therefore

# THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF OAKLAND DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The City Council finds and determines that the foregoing recitals are true and correct and are hereby incorporated herein as findings and determinations of the City Council.

Section 2. The Master Fee Schedule as set forth in Ordinance Number 13497 C.M.S. as amended, is hereby amended to modify and establish the fees assessed by the City Administrator's Office, Department of Transportation, Economic & Workforce Development, Oakland Parks, Recreation & Youth Development Department, Oakland Public Works, Finance Department, Oakland Fire Department, the Office of the City Attorney, Oakland Public Library, Human Services Department, Contract & Compliance Department, and Oakland Animal Services Department, as set forth in Exhibit A, attached hereto, incorporated into and made a part hereof.

Section 3. If any section, subsection, subdivision, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance or any part thereof is for any reason held to be unconstitutional, invalid, or ineffective by any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity or effectiveness of the remainder of the Ordinance or any part thereof.

Section 4. With approval of this ordinance all fees shall hereby be effective July 1, 2019.
