Please tell us how your qualifications and participation will relate to the requested board and/or commission's mission.

My unique qualifications for this role arise primarily from 1) my previous service as a member of the Youth Leadership Council, the city-wide teen advisory board for the Oakland Library System, 2) my public policy analysis skills from my undergraduate and graduate education in Public Policy, and 3) my familiarity with Oakland's government and people from my previous work experience. I was a member of the Youth Leadership Council for roughly three years, from when I was a sophomore in high school until shortly after graduation. While I was a member of this group, I helped advise the library on youth engagement, engage with elected officials, and plan what is now a recurring annual library event (Culture Fest). The experience helped me gain a broad understanding of the work and organization of Oakland's library system and an even greater appreciation of the critical work our librarians do every day. The education I received while I earned graduate and undergraduate degrees in Public Policy will also likely be useful. Among the many topics included were how to evaluate and interpret studies on the impacts of specific public policies, how to compile, analyze, and explain statistical information, how to fully examine the costs and benefits of an action, and the influence of politics on policymaking. This knowledge will be useful in assessing how the library's expenditure of Measure Q funds accomplishes the stated voter objectives, and in weighing the pros and cons of advice the commission may present library leadership with. My internship at the City of Fremont Finance Department provided me with specific training in reading and analyzing government financial statements, which will also be useful for the oversight role of the commission. Finally, as an Oakland native, and as someone who has spent three summers interning in Oakland city government and has been significantly involved in two Oakland political campaigns, I have had the opportunity to engage directly with residents from across Oakland and listen to their aspirations for city government. I have always believed that the library system is not just a place where people find books (as critical a function as that is), it is an opportunity for residents to access a broad variety of services and resources that address many of our city's most pressing challenges. The library system already has a plethora of services and opportunities available, from the tool lending library to college application resources to lawyers in the library and beyond. If I am fortunate enough to be able to serve on the Library Advisory Commission, I will remember the hopes and fears that have been expressed to me these past several years and continually search for new ways the library can help respond to them.
