**RECOMMENDATION** 

Staff Recommends That City Council Adopt A Resolution Awarding A Construction Contract To Columbia Electric Inc., For Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP) Cycle 8, 35th Avenue Improvement Project, Project No. 1004015, The Lowest, Responsible, Responsive Bidder In Accordance With Project Plans, Specifications, State Requirements, And With Contractor's Bid In The Amount Of One Million Four Hundred Fifty-Five Thousand One Hundred Fifty-One Dollars (\$1,455,151)

#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

Approval of this resolution will award a construction contract of \$1,455,151 to Columbia Electric Inc, the lowest, responsible, responsive bidder, for Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP) Cycle 8, 35th Avenue Improvement Project, Project No. 1004015 to implement pedestrian, bicycle and traffic safety improvements on 35th Avenue between East 12th Street and Suter Street. Safety measures include curb ramps, high intensity activated crosswalks. rectangular rapid flashing beacons, a new left turn traffic signal, a protected left-turn lane, a road diet, and buffered bicycle lanes.

#### **BACKGROUND / LEGISLATIVE HISTORY**

In August 2016, the City submitted a grant proposal to Caltrans on 35th Avenue Improvements based on collision history extending back five years. The project area is within Oakland's High Injury network and has a deficit of controlled intersections, with high pedestrian volumes, transit, and is currently recommended for bicycle lanes in the recently passed 2019 Bike Plan. In November 2016, Caltrans awarded a grant to the City in a competitive process base on an evaluation of the overall effectiveness of proposed measures that can reduce the number and severity of collisions for pedestrians, bicyclists and vehicles.

In June 2017, the City Council passed Resolution No. 86818 C.M.S., accepting and appropriating funds as shown in Attachment A, which authorized the City Administrator to accept and appropriate the HSIP Cycle 8 grant for the 35th Avenue Improvement Project.

A summary of project features include the following on 35<sup>th</sup> Avenue:

- Installation of a new left turn signal phase and protected left turn lane at Foothill Boulevard.
- Installation of a variety of crossing improvements including: curb ramps, high intensity activated crosswalks, seven (7) rectangular rapid flashing beacons, three (3) pedestrian hybrid beacons, pedestrian countdown signal heads, and advanced limit lines.
- Implementation of a road diet with buffered bike lanes from East 12<sup>th</sup> Street to International Boulevard.
- Furthermore, one of the pedestrian hybrid beacons and one of the rectangular rapid flashing beacons will be directly in front of the United for Success Academy.

The project is located in Council Districts 4 and 5. For a map and additional detail on project features please refer to **Attachment B**.

On July 30, 2018, while the project was in initial stages of design, there was a collision on 35<sup>th</sup> Avenue northbound near Galindo Street within the project area. A bicyclist was fatally hit by a van. Councilmember Noel Gallo held a community meeting on February 6, 2019 to present and discuss safety measures on 35<sup>th</sup> Avenue. In response to the expressed community concerns, the City prioritized the 35<sup>th</sup> Avenue Improvement Project and expedited implementation.

Based on the grant schedule the City was required to complete design, and to obtain authorization for construction by December 31, 2019. However, as part of expediting this important work, the City advanced its delivery schedule by eight months, obtaining Caltrans authorization for construction on April 8, 2019.

Currently staff are seeking Council approval on a Resolution to award this contract to the lowest responsive and responsible bidder, Columbia Electric.

#### **ANALYSIS AND POLICY ALTERNATIVES**

On June 14 and June 21, 2019, the City placed an advertisement in East Bay Times, Oakland Post, El Mundo, World Journal, The Korean Times, and Daily Pacific Builder/McGraw-Hill inviting construction bids. On July 18, 2019, the Office of City Clerk received two bids in the amounts of \$1,455,151.00 and \$1,582,290.00 from Columbia Electric Inc. and Gruendl Inc. dba Ray's Electric, respectively as shown in *Attachment C*.

The Contract Compliance Division determined that Columbia Electric Inc. bid is Equal Benefits Ordinance (EBO) compliant, meets the Federal Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) 19.97% goal, and is therefore the lowest, responsible, responsive bidder. Columbia Electric Inc.'s bid of \$1,455,151.00 is nineteen percent (19%) below the Engineer's Estimate of \$1,789,337. The Contract Compliance Memorandum is shown in *Attachment D*. Staff determined that Columbia Electric Inc.'s bid is reasonable with available sufficient funds. Hence, Columbia Electric Inc. is recommended to be awarded the contract.

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#### **PUBLIC OUTREACH / INTEREST**

The project was presented to Bicyclist and Pedestrian Advisory Commission (BPAC) during the grant application phase, and received a letter of support thereafter. The project was also presented at the community meeting held by the District 5 Councilmember Gallo in February 2019. City staff also reached out to AC Transit and obtained their support for the project.

The Office of the City Attorney and the Controller's Bureau have reviewed this report and resolution. Staff coordinated with the following City Departments and stakeholders as listed below:

#### **FISCAL IMPACT**

Approval of these Resolutions will authorize the City Administrator to execute a construction contract with Columbia Electric Inc. as follows:

#### AMOUNT OF RECOMMENDATION/COST OF PROJECT:

Construction Contract: \$1,455,151

#### SOURCES OF FUNDING:

The project is funded by the HSIP Cycle 8 grant and Measure BB. Caltrans authorized the use of HSIP Cycle 8 grant for construction contract of the 35<sup>th</sup> Avenue Improvement Project. A local match is required as a condition of the grant.

- Federal HSIP Grant \$1,111,880, State of California, Department of Transportation; Project 1004015, Organization 92270, Expense 57412, Task 8.0, Award 23348, Fund 2116, Program NB33.

#### PAST PERFORMANCE, EVALUATION AND FOLLOW-UP

No Contractor Performance Evaluations on Columbia Electric are available, as the City has no record of previous contracts with them please see *Attachment E*.

#### **SUSTAINABLE OPPORTUNITIES**

**Economic**: This project will improve transportation conditions and make 35<sup>th</sup> Avenue safer, more accessible, and more attractive. In addition, the construction contract will create job opportunities for Oakland residents through the City's contracting requirements.

**Environmental**: The project will provide a safer route for pedestrians, and thereby providing a more attractive alternative mode of transportation to single occupancy vehicles and helping to reduce Oakland's carbon footprint. Furthermore, during construction the project will implement the Best Management Practices for the protection of storm water runoff to prevent pollutants from entering the storm drain system.

**Social Equity**: The project will result in greater mobility, accessibility and safety for pedestrians, bicycles, transit, and vehicular traffic. It will benefit the schools in the project area, especially the United for Success Academy. Persons with disabilities will be particularly benefited by the curb ramps installed, and audible signals built into the traffic signal and beacons. The project is in an area of the City with equity index scores that range from 0.62 to 0.79. Typically, equity index score of 0.50 or higher are considered to be disadvantaged communities. The equity index is based on a number of socio-economic factors including income, education, housing and ethnicity. Overall equity index scores range between 0 and 1.

#### **ACTION REQUESTED OF THE CITY COUNCIL**

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY ADMINISTRATOR DIRECTOR OF TRANSPORTATION OR HIS/HER DESIGNEE TO ACCEPT SIX AND **APPROPRIATE HIGHWAY** IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM CYCLE 8 (HSIP8) GRANTS TOTALING \$10.000.000 IMPLEMENT SAFETY AND TO **OPERATIONAL IMPROVEMENTS** FOR PEDESTRIANS. **BICYCLISTS** MOTORISTS AT VARIOUS STREETS AND INTERSECTIONS IN THE CITY OF OAKLAND. ALLOCATE \$3,066,200 IN MEASURE B. MEASURE BB AND MEASURE KK INFRASTRUCTURE BOND FUNDS AS THE REQUIRED CITY LOCAL MATCH.

WHEREAS, on August 12, 2016, the City of Oakland submitted six grant proposals under Highway Safety Improvement Program Cycle 8 (HSIP8); and

WHEREAS, on January 5, 2017, the City of Oakland received an approval on all six HSIP8 projects for a total project cost of Thirteen Million Sixty Six Thousand and Two Hundred Dollars (\$13,066,200) which includes a federal grant portion of \$10,000,000 and a required City local match portion of \$3,066,200 which represents 23.47 percent of the total project cost as a condition of the HSIP8 grant; and

WHEREAS, under the Bancroft Avenue Improvements Project, a federal grant portion of \$3,595,291 and a City local match portion of \$1,175,409 will be used to install crosswalk enhancement, bicycle enhancement, bulb-out, and signal upgrades; and

WHEREAS, under the Fruitvale Avenue Improvements Project, a federal grant portion of \$1,105,183 and a City local match portion of \$361,317 will be used to install crosswalk enhancement, road diet, Class II bicycle lanes, parking lane reduction, signal upgrades, and protected left turn phase; and

WHEREAS, under the 35<sup>th</sup> Avenue Improvements Project, a federal grant portion of \$2,188,360 and a City local match portion of \$715,440 will be used to install crosswalk enhancement, lane reduction, buffered bicycle lanes, signal upgrades, and protected left turn phase; and

WHEREAS, under the High Street Improvements Project, a federal grant portion of \$1,580,566 and a City local match portion of \$516,734 will be used to install new crosswalks, crosswalk enhancement, and signal upgrades; and

WHEREAS, under the Downtown Improvements Project, a federal grant portion of \$527,031 and a City local match portion of \$102,369 will be used to install crosswalk enhancement and signal upgrades; and

WHEREAS, under the Oakland Hills Improvements Project, a federal grant portion of \$1,003,569 and a City local match portion of \$194,931 will be used to upgrade existing guardrail section and install asphalt concrete berms; and

WHEREAS, the City has prepared an preliminary traffic and safety assessment at all project sites to address safety, access and mobility, and to identify countermeasures to address deficiencies; and

WHEREAS, the Public Works Department has requested a waiver of the 1.5% public art fee for this project because HSIP guidelines only allows funding uses to traffic safety improvements and prohibit the use of grant funds for public art; now therefore, be it

**RESOLVED:** That the City Council authorizes to accept and appropriate federal grants in an amount not to exceed \$10,000,000 and allocate a City local match totaling \$3,066,200 for the six projects as listed below; and

**RESOLVED:** That the City Council authorizes to accept and appropriate federal grants of \$3,595,291 and allocate a City local match of \$1,175,409 for the Bancroft Avenue Improvements Project; and

**RESOLVED:** That the City Council authorizes to accept and appropriate federal grants of \$1,105,183 and allocate a City local match of \$361,317 for the Fruitvale Avenue Improvements Project; and

**RESOLVED:** That the City Council authorizes to accept and appropriate federal grants of \$2,188,360 and allocate a City local match of \$715,440 for the 35<sup>th</sup> Avenue Improvements Project; and

**RESOLVED:** That the City Council authorizes to accept and appropriate federal grants of \$1,580,566 and allocate a City local match of \$516,734 for the High Street Improvements Project; and

**RESOLVED:** That the City Council authorizes to accept and appropriate federal grants of \$527,031 and allocate a City local match of \$102,369 for the Downtown Improvements Project; and

**RESOLVED:** That the City Council authorizes to accept and appropriate federal grants of \$1,003,569 and allocate a City local match of \$194,931 for the Oakland Hills Improvements Project; and

**FURTHER RESOLVED:** That said federal grant funds will be deposited and appropriated in the Department of Transportation Fund (2116), Department of Transportation (Traffic Capital Projects Organization 30264 and Engineering Design: Traffic/Parking Organization 92246), and

in a project number to be established for each project; and be it

**FURTHER RESOLVED:** That said City local match funds is available in Measure B Fund (2211), Measure BB Fund (2216), Measure KK Infrastructure Bond (5330), Department of Transportation, Organization (30264 and 92246), Expense (56611, 57411, 57412); and be it

**FURTHER RESOLVED:** That the City Council authorizes the implementation of all six HSIP8 projects, namely Bancroft Avenue Improvements Project, Fruitvale Avenue Improvements Project, High Street Improvements Project, Downtown Improvements Project, and Oakland Hills Improvements Project; and be it

**FURTHER RESOLVED:** That the City Administrator or designee shall file a Notice of Determination/Notice of Exemption with the clerk of the County of Alameda and the Office of Planning and Research on each of the six HSIP8 projects.



#### Major Crossing Safety Improvements (Projected Completion Date: 2020)

Below are a series of significant safety improvements along 35<sup>th</sup> Avenue between E.12<sup>th</sup> Street and Interstate 580 overpass:



- SS-1: 35<sup>th</sup> from International Blvd to E 12<sup>th</sup> St: Lane reduction and addition of bike lanes
- A: 35<sup>th</sup> @ E 18<sup>th</sup> St: Flashing Pedestrian Crossing Signal and Crosswalk Upgrade
- **B:** 35<sup>th</sup> @ Foothill Blvd: Crosswalk Upgrades, and Signal Upgrades including a left-turn phase
- C: 35th @ Harper St:
   Flashing Pedestrian Crossing
   Signal and Crosswalk Upgrade
- **D:** 35th @ Salisbury St: Pedestrian Activated Signal and Crosswalk Upgrade
- E: 35th @ Davis St: Pedestrian Activated Signal and Crosswalk Upgrade
- F: 35th @ Lynde St: Flashing Pedestrian Crossing Signal and Crosswalk Upgrade
- G: 35th @ Deering St:
   Flashing Pedestrian Crossing
   Signal and Crosswalk Upgrade
- H: 35th @ Brookdale

#### **Short-Term Paving and Restriping Improvements**


OakDOT will perform road maintenance and restripe the road along 35<sup>th</sup> Avenue, from the Fruitvale BART Station up to Sutter Avenue, when weather dries and warms in spring 2019. These improvements were scheduled for late 2018 but delayed by weather conditions. Improvements will include:

- Refreshed crosswalk markings
- Additional signage ("Yield to Pedestrians") and traffic markings at uncontrolled crosswalks to highlight the crosswalks for drivers
- New striping on the right side of the travel lanes on 35<sup>th</sup> to help reduce speeds
- Ensuring sidewalks are meeting engineering standards for red curb near uncontrolled crosswalks, creating more space to increase pedestrian visibility

Additionally, OakDOT has added Galindo Street and Brookdale Avenue, surrounding their intersections with 35th Avenue, to the list of priority streets for repaying in 2019.

#### **Longer-Term Bicycle Safety Improvements**

OakDOT is also developing a bicycle safety project on East 12<sup>th</sup> Street and 35<sup>th</sup> Avenue, with construction estimated to begin in 2020. Below is a preliminary design:

**WHEREAS,** in November 2016, the City was awarded a Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP) Cycle 8 grant to fund the 35<sup>th</sup> Avenue Improvement Project; and
