Supplemental Report re: Travel Authorization for the Annual Legislative

Conference of the Congressional Black Caucus

Colleagues on the City Council and Members of the Public:

As you know, here in Oakland we are proud of our African American heritage, and committed to preserving and uplifting our African American residents who have contributed so much to making Oakland a great city. That being said, our latest Equity indicators report shows us clearly that we are not living up to our stated values and goals and our Black residents are facing tremendous inequitable outcomes across economic, health, education, and public safety indicators. The problems we face in Oakland are not unique, but manifest themselves across the country. That is why it is important for us to continue to be in dialogue with communities across the country as we tackle the challenges of institutionalized racism – both explicit and implicit - that created the circumstances we experience today.

It is in this spirit that we were honored to represent the City of Oakland and you this year at the Congressional Black Caucus Annual Legislative Conference (CBC ALC) in Washington DC between September 11th and September 15th. During those 6 days in Washington DC, we had the opportunity to engage with elected officials from across the country at all levels of government – local, state, and national, to discuss our common goals, challenges, and opportunities as well as our individual best practices and lessons learned so that we could return home and apply new knowledge, insights, connections, and tools toward addressing the African American agenda nationally.

Highlights of our experience are as follows:

- Meetings on Capitol Hill with our representatives in DC including Congresswoman Barbara Lee, and the offices of Senator Kamala Harris, and Senator Dianne Feinstein – to discuss a range of topics affecting Oakland residents and how we can access greater federal resources to address them.
- Meeting with the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) to better understand their strategy for addressing homelessness and opportunities to tap into additional federal resources



- Meeting with the Office of Chair of the House Financial Services Committee to discuss financial oversight and monitoring of investors and ways to improve Federal programs like the Economic Opportunity Zone program to ensure that native residents benefit
- Meeting with Representatives from the Cuban Embassy to explore opportunities to increase trade between the Port of Oakland and Cuba/Caribbean
- Various Legislative sessions on topics ranging from economic development
 without displacement for underserved communities, to empowerment of the
 Black Female leaders in government, business, healthcare, and criminal justice,
 to pathways for reforming the criminal justice system, to the role of the church in
 stemming the mental health epidemic, and more
