My patient population is at high risk to dental caries and obesity due to their SSB consumption. The oral health education, motivational interviewing, restorative treatment, and dental disease prevention that I provide in the dental clinic are effective in helping my patients overcome their SSB consumption habits but these efforts are not enough. Outside the dental clinic, I have taken the opportunity to work on campaigns at the city and county level that have helped to generate funding for health care and to address the social determinants of health. I participate in and help to plan activities that help to mobilize the community. Most recently, I served on the Alameda County Health Care for the Homeless Oral Health Steering Committee When I was active in All In Alameda County convened by Supervisor Wilma Chan, I held a very productive community listening session. I volunteer at and help to plan health fairs throughout the city. RESOLUTION CONFIRMING THE MAYOR'S APPOINTMENT OF PAMELA ALSTON, RAPHAEL BREINES, AND MICHAEL HAMMOCK AS MEMBERS OF THE SUGAR-SWEETENED BEVERAGE DISTRIBUTION TAX COMMUNITY ADVISORY BOARD

WHEREAS, Ordinance No 86161 C.M.S., approved May 3, 2016, placed a measure on the November 8, 2016 ballot to impose a tax on the distribution of sugar-sweetened beverages; and

WHEREAS, the voters of the City of Oakland adopted the Sugar-Sweetened Beverage Distribution Tax Ordinance in the November 8, 2016 general municipal election; and

WHEREAS, the Sugar-Sweetened Beverage Distribution Tax Ordinance establishes the Sugar-Sweetened Beverage Distribution Tax Community Advisory Board (the "Board") and provides that the Board shall consist of nine (9) members serving not more than two consecutive three-year terms appointed by the Mayor and confirmed by the City Council in accordance with City Charter section 601; and

WHEREAS, the Sugar-Sweetened Beverage Distribution Tax Ordinance (Oakland Municipal Code Section 4.52.080 (B)) provides that the Board shall be comprised of: At least three residents who live in areas disproportionately impacted by diseases caused by sugar consumption; two medical professionals--one medical and one dental with public health experience or who engage in whole or in part in the prevention, diagnosis, treatment or research of, or education about chronic diseases linked to the consumption of sugar; two parents of current students of Oakland Unified School District ("OUSD"); and two members of the public with experience in addressing public health issues, related to diabetes, obesity and sugary drink consumption, community-based youth food and nutrition programs, school-based food and nutrition programs, oral health or early childhood nutrition; and

WHEREAS, the Honorable Mayor Libby Schaaf has appointed Pamela Alston, Raphael Breines, and Michael Hammock to complete three-year terms subject to confirmation by the City Council; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That pursuant to City Charter section 601, the City Council hereby confirms the Mayor's appointment of:
