#### RECOMMENDATION

Staff Recommends That The City Council Adopt A Resolution Authorizing The City Administrator, Or Her Designee, To: 1) Enter Into A Grant Agreement With The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) To Accept Assistance To Firefighters Grant (AFG) Funds In The Amount Of Seventy Four Thousand Five Hundred Forty Six Dollars (\$74,546,00); 2) Accept, Appropriate, And Administer Said AFG Funds; And 3) Expend Funds To Purchase Equipment, In Accordance With The City's Purchasing Guidelines.

#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

In October of 2018, the Oakland Fire Department (OFD) applied for and was awarded on August 29, 2019 the AFG grant in the amount of seventy-four thousand five hundred forty-six dollars (\$74,546.00). The grant is intended to fund the purchase of a new Self-Contained Breathing Apparatus (SCBA)fixed fill station and to make upgrades to our existing mobile fill station.

#### **BACKGROUND / LEGISLATIVE HISTORY**

The primary goal of the Assistance to Firefighters Grant (AFG) is to meet the firefighting and emergency response needs of fire departments and nonaffiliated emergency medical service organizations. Since 2001, AFG has helped firefighters and other first responders obtain critically needed equipment, protective gear, emergency vehicles, training and other resources necessary for protecting the public and emergency personnel from fire and related hazards.

#### ANALYSIS AND POLICY ALTERNATIVES

Replacement of the department's 2005 self-contained breathing apparatus (SCBA) fill station is essential and necessary to maintain compliance with NFPA 1989, 1500 and 1404 as well as the Code of Federal Regulations 1910.134. Within the past year, the department invested approximately twelve thousand dollars (\$12,000.00) to maintain and repair OFD's antiquated fixed fill station and approximately ten thousand dollars (\$10.000.00) on OFD's mobile fill station simply to keep them operational. Previously, during the repairs, the Oakland Fire Department

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required the use of neighboring fire departments to assist with filling the Oakland Fire Department's SCBA cylinders. The AFG grant will ensure the department has the operational equipment to support every Oakland firefighter in the field.

#### SUSTAINABLE OPPORTUNITIES

**Economic**: Acceptance of this grant will provide funding to replace the current fixed SCBA fill station and to upgrade current mobile SCBA fill station.

**Environmental**: The Oakland Fire Department will maintain the fixed fill station as a backup emergency piece of equipment, so there should be no environmental impact.

**Race and Equity**: This equipment supports Oakland firefighters in their daily mission to protect lives and property.

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#### ACTION REQUESTED OF THE CITY COUNCIL

Staff recommends that the City Council adopt a resolution authorizing the City Administrator, or her designee, to: 1) Enter into a grant agreement with the federal emergency management agency (FEMA) to accept Assistance to Firefighters Grant (AFG) Funds in the amount of seventy four thousand five hundred forty six dollars (\$74,546.00); 2) accept, appropriate, and administer said AFG funds; and 3) expend funds to purchase equipment, in accordance with the City's purchasing guidelines.
