President Kaplan and Members of the City Council:

Pursuant to Section 401 of the Charter, the City Attorney has prepared and requests your approval of a resolution authorizing compromise and settlement of the above-entitled claim for the sum of Seventy-Five Thousand Dollars and Zero Cents (\$75,000.00), payable to Plaintiffs Max and Feliciana Lynn, through their attorneys, the law firm of Walkup, Melodia, Kelly & Schoenberger.

This action arises out of the death of Plaintiffs' son Kevin Lynn, who allegedly fell on June 1, 2018, from the exterior fire escape at the Paramount Theatre, which is owned by the City of Oakland. Plaintiffs allege a claim for dangerous condition on public property against the City of Oakland.

The Council authorized settlement of this case in Closed Session on Tuesday, January 21, 2020 (moved by Councilmember Lynette Gibson McElhaney and seconded by Councilmember Nikki Fortunato Bas - 8 Ayes).


