Steven Lau, to serve a three-year term that began October 9, 2017 and ending October 8, 2020, filling a seat previously held by Daryl Meshack.

Karen Nakamura, to serve a three-year term that began September 3, 2019 and ending September 2, 2022, filling a seat previously held by herself.
