RECOMMENDATION

Staff Recommends That The City Council Adopt The Following Pieces Of Legislation:

- 2) A Resolution Authorizing The City Of Oakland, A California Municipal Corporation, To Apply For, Accept And Appropriate Grant Funds Under The State Of California Department Of Housing And Community Development's Infill Infrastructure Grant Program Of 2019 In Connection With The Ancora Place Project At 2227 International Boulevard, In An Amount Not To Exceed \$7,500,000;

- 9) A Resolution Authorizing The City Of Oakland, A California Municipal Corporation, To Apply For, Accept And Appropriate Grant Funds Under The State Of California Department Of Housing And Community Development's Infill Infrastructure Grant Program Of 2019 In Connection With The 7th & Campbell Project At 1666 7th Street, In An Amount Not To Exceed \$7,500,000; And
- 10) A Resolution Authorizing The City Of Oakland, A California Municipal Corporation, To Apply For, Accept And Appropriate Grant Funds Under The State Of California Department Of Housing And Community Development's Infill Infrastructure Grant Program Of 2019 In Connection With The 500 Lake Park Apartments Project At 500 Lake Park Avenue, In An Amount Not to Exceed \$3,700,000.
- 11) A Resolution Authorizing The City Of Oakland, A California Municipal Corporation, To Apply For, Accept And Appropriate Funds Under The State Of California Department Of Housing And Community Development's Infill Infrastructure Grant Program In Connection With The LakeHouse Commons Affordable Apartments Project At 121 East 12th Street, In An Amount Not To Exceed \$5,000,000.

REASON FOR SUPPLEMENTAL

Due to updated cost projections, the developer of the 7th & Campbell project would now like to seek an additional \$2,500,000 in Infill Infrastructure Grant (IIG) funds. The resolution associated with the 7th & Campbell project has been modified to reflect an updated funding request of \$7,500,000. No other changes are being made at this time.

A first supplemental agenda report was previously submitted in order to add a project, LakeHouse Commons Affordable Apartments, that was not originally included due to a staff oversight. This is a second supplemental agenda report.

The increased funding request changes the original agenda report in the following ways:

 Instead of seeking a total sum of up to \$84 million, the City will now seek up to \$86.5 million from the State of California Department of Housing and Community Development.

If this modified resolution is not adopted by City Council prior to the February 18, 2020 application deadline, the City and developer will only be authorized to apply for up to \$5,000,000 in IIG program funds as originally planned.
