RECOMMENDATION

Staff Recommends That The City Council Receive A Bi-Annual Informational Report From The Oakland Police Department (OPD) On Crime Data In The City Of Oakland.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Attachment A to this report provides information on crime data in the City of Oakland for the periods of January 1, 2019 - June 30, 2019 as well as July 1, 2019 - December 31, 2019. The data covers 2019 policing accomplishments, crime trends and public safety challenges, and 2020 policing goals. The report also covers areas of focus for each of the City's five police areas.

BACKGROUND / LEGISLATIVE HISTORY

In 2013 the Public Safety Committee requested a quarterly report from OPD on crime trends and crime reduction activities in the City of Oakland. The Public Safety committee in 2018 changed the format to a bi-annual report. OPD presented a 2019 bi-annual report to the Public Safety Committee on June 25, 2019, covering the period of January 1, 2019 through May 31, 2019.

ANALYSIS / POLICY ALTERNATIVES

Attachment A covers policing accomplishments, crime trends and public safety challenges, and 2020 policing goals, as well as areas of focus - for each of the City's five police areas. The crime data covers the periods of January 1, 2019 - June 30, 2019 as well as July 1, 2019 -December 31, 2019. The data also compares 2019 to the preceding year (2018), and looks at a 3-year average.

The data in this report is hierarchy-based. Crime totals reflect one offense – the most severe per incident. These statistics are drawn from the OPD crime database, and are unaudited, and not used for the crime figures reported to the Federal Bureau of Investigation's Universal Crime Reporting (UCR). This report is generated by the date crimes occurred. Statistics can be affected by late reporting, the geo-coding process, the reclassification, or un-founding crimes. Because crime reporting and data entry can run behind the date of crime incidents, all crimes may not be recorded.
