RESOLUTION (1) ADOPTING THE **FISCAL** YEAR 2021-22 WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT BUDGET; (2) AUTHORIZING GRANT AWARD **AGREEMENTS WITH SERVICE PROVIDERS** COMPETITIVELY SELECTED BY THE OAKLAND WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT BOARD TO PROVIDE COMPREHENSIVE CAREER SERVICES, ADULT CAREER SERVICES, AND YOUTH CAREER SERVICES FROM WORKFORCE INNOVATION AND OPPORTUNITY ACT TITLE I FUNDS AND OTHER FUNDS FOR FISCAL YEAR 2021-22; (3) AUTHORIZING THE CARRYOVER OF UNSPENT FISCAL YEAR 2020-21 FUNDS TO CONTRACTED SERVICE PROVIDERS IN FISCAL YEAR 2021-22 AND (4) AUTHORIZING THE CITY ADMINISTRATOR TO APPLY FOR AND ACCEPT GRANTS AND CONTRIBUTIONS FOR WORKFORCE **DEVELOPMENT SERVICES BEYOND** WORKFORCE INNOVATION AND OPPORTUNITY ACT TITLE I FORMULA FUNDING AND OTHER BUDGETED FUNDING SOURCES UP TO \$250,000 PER INSTANCE WITH THE APPROVAL OF THE OAKLAND WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT BOARD

WHEREAS, the Oakland Workforce Development Board ("OWDB") is mandated to oversee the expenditure of the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act of 2014 ("WIOA") funding in partnership with the Mayor as local chief elected official in a designated workforce development area such as the City of Oakland; and

WHEREAS, the OWDB budget is made up of multiple funding streams that support the workforce development work; and

WHEREAS, the City Council adopted a Council Resolution No. 88717 C.M.S. on June 24, 2021, to adopt the Fiscal Year ("FY") 2021- 23 biennial budget, which appropriates funds for the expenditures proposed by said budget; and

WHEREAS, through the FY 2021-23 biennial budget, \$3,205,307 in WIOA Title I formula funds for FY 2021-22 are appropriated for adult, dislocated worker, youth, and rapid response services; and

- WHEREAS, the FY 2021-23 biennial budget also includes a general fund appropriation of \$1,980,699 to support workforce development services and activities including \$220,000 to the Day Laborer program; \$60,000 to the One-stop Operator; \$500,000 for workforce development, job readiness and placement activities; \$175,000 each to: Youth Employment Partnership, Lao Family Community Development, Oakland Private Industry Council and Restore Oakland; \$75,000 each to: Civicorps, Cypress Mandela and Rising Sun; \$123,443 to support City internal service fees; and \$402,256 to support 2.76 FTE; and
- WHEREAS, the City Council also authorized the use of Oakland Army Base billboard revenue to support the West Oakland Job Resource Center ("WOJRC") and the FY 2021-23 biennial budget appropriates \$504,272 for oversight and support the ongoing operations of the WOJRC with \$345,615 directly to the WOJRC to support the ongoing operations of the WOJRC; and
- WHEREAS, the OWDB has selected, through a competitive request for proposals process, the service providers specified below to provide employment and training services to adults, dislocated workers, youth with WIOA Title I formula funds and other funds received by the OWDB and the City; and
- WHEREAS, under Section 14211 of the California Unemployment Insurance Code, thirty percent (30%) of the combined adult and dislocated worker funding must be used on eligible training services to assist job seekers with training and employment goals within the first FY; and
- WHEREAS, WIOA Section 129(a)(4) requires the minimum out-of-school youth expenditure rate, minus administrative costs, for the youth formula-funded program be seventy-five percent (75%); and
- WHEREAS, WIOA Section 129(c)(4) prioritizes work experience with the requirement that the local workforce development area must spend a minimum of twenty percent (20%) of non-administrative youth formula funds on work experience activities; and
- WHEREAS, to provide greater flexibility to meet the current circumstances and related impacts due to COVID-19, the OWDB authorized any FY 2020-21 contracted funds not fully spent by service providers by June 30, 2021 be carried over into FY 2021-22; and
- WHEREAS, any funds authorized by City Council Under this Resolution but not previously approved by the OWDB will be resubmitted to the OWDB for allocation and approval at its next meeting; and
- WHEREAS, from time to time the City, on behalf of the OWDB, will have the opportunity to apply for and receive grant funds and contributions above and beyond the WIOA Title I formula funds to help build capacity and diversify funding for the workforce system; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED: That the City Council hereby accepts the following FY 2021-2022 Workforce Development Budget, and is authorized to enter into agreements pertaining to acceptance of such funds

FURTHER RESOLVED: That any funds authorized by City Council under this Resolution but not previously approved by the OWDB will be resubmitted to the OWDB for allocation and approval at its next meeting; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: That City Council authorizes any FY 2020-21 contracted funds not fully spent by service providers by June 30, 2021 to be carried over into FY 2021-22; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: That each contract for workforce development activities shall have specific performance benchmarks consistent with program regulations, and that the City shall terminate the contract of a service provider that materially fails to meet contract performance, with funds reallocated to existing service providers or an on-call pool; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: That given possible variances in WIOA allocations from the U.S Department of Labor and the California Employment Development Department, the City Administrator is authorized to accept any additional WIOA funding allocations for FY 2021-22 above the adopted biennial policy budget allocation without returning to the City Council; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: That the City Council authorizes the City Administrator to apply for and accept grants, funds and contributions on behalf of the City and the OWDB to help build capacity and diversify funding for the workforce system up to an additional \$250,000 with the approval of the OWDB; provided, that contract recommendations and appropriations for the use of such funds with service providers must be submitted to Council for approval through FY 2021-2022; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: That any additional funds received outside of WIOA are hereby appropriated to a fund to be determined, Workforce Development Org (85311), various Expenditure accounts, in Projects to be determined, and in Workforce Program (SC03); and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: That the City Administrator is hereby authorized to spend funds in FY 2021-22 and take other action with respect to the adopted budget and authorized contracts consistent with the Resolution and its basic purposes.
