This Ordinance would authorize the City Administrator to negotiate and enter into a license with Housing Consortium of the East Bay ("HCEB") on land owned. by: Caltrans that will be leased by the City at 3rd Street and Peralta Street, for a term up to three years at no monthly rent in exchange for the value of the services provided to unsheltered residents and the City at large. The Ordinance would amend Ordinance No. 1359 to authorize the license with HCEB instead of a license to Govenant House on this property. This Ordinance makes exemption find-ings under the California Environmen-tal Quality Act

ORDINANCE AMENDING OAKLAND MUNICIPAL CODE CHAPTER 2.04, PURCHASING SYSTEM, TO AMEND SECTION 2.04.051 TO CONFIRM AND CLARIFY, THE AUTHORITY OF THE CITY ADMINISTRATOR TO WAIVE RFP/Q REQUIREMENTS FOR PRO-FESSIONAL SERVICES CONTRACTS UP TO FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$50,000.00) ON BEHALF OF THE POLICE COMMISSION

This Ordinance will amend Oakland's Purchasing Ordinance codified at Oak-land Municipal Code Title I, Chapter 2.04, to Confirm and clarify the author-ity of the City Administrator to waive RFP/Q requirements for professional services contracts up to fifty thousand (\$50,000) on behalf of the Police Com-mission by amending Section 2.04.051 A.2 and 2.04.051 B. as follows:

2.04.051 - Competitive process and qualification-based awards for profes-sional services contracts.

A. Request for Qualifications or Proposal for Professional Services Contracts in Excess of Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00).

(\$50,000.00), 1. City Administrator Responsibility, The City Administrator or the City Ad-ministrator's designee shall conduct a request for proposal ("RFP") or request for qualifications ("RFP") or request thousand contracts that exceed fifty thousand collars (\$50,000.00) and are-exempt from bidding binder. Subse-tion 2.04,050,11. The RFP/Q process shall be conducted in accordance with Section 2.04,040 B.4, above. The Citys RFP and REQ processes shall be set forth in a City Administrator's admin-istrative instruction. The RFP/or RFQ requirement applies, but is not limited to, contracts for professional, technical services shall be based on demonstrat-ed competence and qualifications for the types of contracts to professional

Police Commission Responsibility, The CPRA Director shall conduct a re-quest for proposal ("RFP") or request for qualifications ("RPQ") process for all contracts to be awarded by the Police Commission for which a RFP/O process is required. The RFP/Q pro-cess shall be conducted in accordance with Section 2.04.040 BA, above. The informal RFP/O process set forth in Section 2.04.040 B.3 is not required for professional services contracts up to fifty thousand dollars (\$55,000.000) for which a waiver is obtainedpursuant Section 2.04.05 1 B, below.

B. Waiver-City Administrator Authority, City Council Authority. Upon a finding by the City Administrator that it is in the best interests of the City, the City Administrator may waive said RFP/Q requirements for professional services contracts up to fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000.00). The foregoing is not applicable to the Police Commission. Upon a finding by the City Council or its designee that it is in the best inter-ests of the City, the City Council may waive said RFP/Q requirements for contracts in any amount.
