RECOMMENDATION

Staff Recommends That City Council Adopt A Resolution Ratifying Actions Taken By The Mayor During The Oakland City Council 2021 Annual Recess In Conformance With Rule 21 Of The Council's Rules Of Procedures Codified In Resolution No. 88266 C.M.S., Passed July 28, 2020.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

During the City Council annual recess period, the Mayor is authorized to take actions that would normally be taken by the City Council that cannot be deferred for Council action following the recess, except for those reserved for the City Council pursuant to the City Charter as referenced in Rule 21 of the Council's Rules of Procedures, Resolution No. 88266 C.M.S., (Attachment A).

In accordance with Rule 21 of the Council's Rules of Procedures, this report requests that the City Council confirm the action taken during the 2021 annual recess. City of Oakland Recess Agenda dated August 24, 2021 (*Attachment B*).

BACKGROUND / LEGISLATIVE HISTORY

The City Council annual summer recess commences August 1st through August 31st each year. During the recess, City of Oakland business is governed by specific sections of the Oakland Municipal Code (O.M.C.) and Council's Rules of Procedures (Resolution No. 88266 C.M.S.).

O.M.C. 2.04.020.(H) states that during the City Council annual recess, the City Administrator's purchasing authority shall not exceed \$500,000 for goods, materials, supplies, services, and construction contracts, and \$300,000 for professional and consultant services. Council approval is not required for contracts within these limits during the recess, provided vendors and contractors are selected in accordance with the City's advertising and bidding/request for proposal/qualifications requirements, and other requirements of the Purchasing Ordinance.

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Contract approvals exceeding the foregoing recess purchasing levels must set forth reasons why the item cannot be deferred until the Council's legislative session resumes. All actions exceeding the Mayor's authority during the Council recess are set forth in the Council's Rules of Procedures.

Council's Rules of Procedures, Rule 21, *Action During Council Recess*, authorizes the Mayor to take action during the Council recess under the following circumstances:

- Actions that would normally be taken by the Council <u>except for</u> actions 1) requiring the adoption of an ordinance, and 2) appropriating funds.
- Purchases carried out during the recess must conform to the requirements set forth in the Purchasing Ordinance. For example, funds must be previously budgeted by the City Council for the purchase and staff must conduct advertising and/or bidding Request for Proposal/ Qualification (RFP/Q) processes as required by the Purchasing Ordinance, Oakland Municipal Code Section Ch. 2.04.
- Resolutions and agenda reports for purchases approved during the recess must be
 posted on the summer recess 2-week agenda to provide public notice and the
 opportunity for public comment and input for matters to be approved on behalf of the
 Council during the recess.
- Purchases and other approvals involving expenditure or disposition of funds are limited to previously adopted budgeted amounts.
- Justification is provided as to why actions taken on behalf of the Council during the recess cannot be deferred for Council approval after recess, except contracts authorized under O.M.C. section 2.04.020.H (City Administrator Recess Purchasing Authority).

Rule 21 also states that the Mayor may convene emergency Council meetings to take emergency actions necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health or safety.

ANALYSIS AND POLICY ALTERNATIVES

Pursuant to the Council's Rules of Procedures, the following action and resolution was approved by the Mayor during the 2021 annual recess and is presented to the City Council for confirmation.

 Resolution Fixing The Rate Of Property Tax And Levying A Tax On Real And Personal Property In The City Of Oakland For Fiscal Year 2021-2022 For Voter-Approved Indebtedness (See Executive Summary in the Agenda Report dated August 24, 2021 for reasons the item could not be deferred) *Attachment B*.

FISCAL IMPACT

There is no fiscal impact associated with this report and resolution. Fiscal impacts related to the item approved during the Council recess is discussed in the agenda report included in *Attachment B.*
