I am a storyteller. I am a poet. I am a stepmother to two and birthmother to one, each born and growing roots within Oakland, California. I am a social entrepreneur and cultural creator whose commitment is to an embodied ethic of justice and belonging, wherever I am invited in. As a child of voluntary immigrants as New World and Old Country—I understand the particular experience of being neither here nor there; of being immigrant and poor, woman and artist of color, Hip Hop and intellectual, spiritual and revolutionary. Like many of those I've had the privilege of serving and speaking with during my tenure as an artist and organizer, I, too, have felt trapped between the Hyphen that says brown skin is culturally, here. And not. My nuanced and complex story is my gift. And I believe it is what calls me to this moment of service. I believe deeply that it is my civic duty to throw my name in the hat to help steward our city's vision for more vibrant communities and robust cultural movements. As an artist, racial justice educator and healing-informed facilitator with an international network, I have travelled to cities, neighborhoods and institutions across many dividing lines. I have mentored and been mentored, learned about program design and help build programs and whole organizations with young musicians, muralists, dancers, spoken word poets and community arts leaders in Guam, India, Pine Ridge (South Dakota), Miami, Anchorage, Honolulu, Baltimore, Philadelphia, Detroit and Flint. As a professional trainer and emerging businesswoman, I have advised on cultural strategies with educational leaders at Harvard University's Graduate School of Education, neuroscientists at Stanford University, members of the original cast of Hamilton: An American Musical, as well as clinical therapists engaged in post-modern, narrative therapy. I have worked closely with dozens of Oakland artist, strategists and cultural institutions to create, sustain and strengthen local creative communities of practice. I've hosted conversations with renown cultural historians and social innovators of our time including Jeff Chang, Samina Ali, Daveed Diggs, Laurene Powell Jobbs, Roberta Uno, Yosimar Reyes, Natalie Basile, Marc Bamuthi Joseph, Chinaka Hodge and Deborah Santana. It's by and through these conversations that I've concluded this simple, and sometimes elusive, truth about civic participation: that one's willingness to try to dream a collective dream might out weight political understanding or experience. (Of course, these things help.) And so many artists I know and admire grip to the notion that government is a barrier to creative action and cultural innovation. Sometimes, it feels that way to me, too. And still, my commitment is to try. And to serve in optimism inside visionary processes where artists co-construct cultural legacies that define spaces of belonging. This is also the poet's duty—to remember how we are creators of systems and nuanced processes. Right now, institutions like the National Endowment for the Arts and National Endowment for Humanities, built to sustain creativity, free speech and courageous thought, are under attack. I believe that as an artist, it's my duty to engage my language, my poems and immigrant story to serve those among us who endeavor and endure for beauty and art and healing in this small circle we call home.



RESOLUTION CONFIRMING THE MAYOR'S REAPPOINTMENT OF KEVIN CHOICE, J. K. FOWLER, MICHELLE LEE, DIANE SANCHEZ, AND THEO AYTCHAN WILLIAMS TO THE CULTURAL AFFAIRS COMMISSION

WHEREAS, Section 601 of the City Charter provides that members of City boards and commissions shall be appointed by the Mayor subject to confirmation by the affirmative vote of five members of the City Council; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 11323 C.M.S., amended by Ordinance Nos. 11778 C.M.S. and 13561 C.M.S., establishes the Cultural Affairs Commission as a professionally qualified citizen committee responsible for advising the City regarding all matters affecting arts and cultural development in the City of Oakland; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 13561 C.M.S provides that all terms shall commence on October 1 and end on September 30, and for the initial appointment only, four members shall be appointed for a three-year term, four members shall be appointed for a two-year term, and three members shall be appointed for a one-year term, and thereafter, all appointments shall be for three years; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 13561 C.M.S. provides that no person shall be appointed to serve as a member of the Cultural Affairs Commission for more than two consecutive three-year terms plus any initial term of less than two years; and

WHEREAS, the Honorable Mayor Libby Schaaf has reappointed Kevin Choice, J. K. Fowler, Michelle Lee, Diane Sanchez and Theo Aytchan Williams to serve a three year term on the Cultural Affairs Commission; now therefore, be it,

RESOLVED: That the City Council hereby confirms the Mayor's reappointment of:

Kevin Choice, to serve a three-year term on the Cultural Affairs Commission beginning October 1, 2021 and ending September 30, 2024.

J. K. Fowler, to serve a three-year term on the Cultural Affairs Commission beginning October 1, 2021 and ending September 30, 2024.

Michelle Lee, to serve a three-year term on the Cultural Affairs Commission beginning October 1, 2021 and ending September 30, 2024.

Diane Sanchez, to serve a three-year term on the Cultural Affairs Commission beginning October 1, 2021 and ending September 30, 2024.

Theo Aytchan Williams, to serve a three-year term on the Cultural Affairs Commission beginning October 1, 2020 and ending September 30, 2023.
