- 1. Proposed changes in the boundaries of the parking and business improvement area or in any benefit zone within the area: There are no proposed changes to the boundaries of the Rockridge Business Improvement District.
- 2. Improvements and activities to be provided in fiscal year 2022-2023: Please see attached Accomplishments for this year to date and attached 2022-2023 proposed budget. We plan to continue on the same course.
- 3. Estimate of the cost of providing the improvements and activities for fiscal year 2022-2023: See attached budget. Should the current COVID 19 pandemic significantly affect the amount of BID revenues received from the City in 2022, appropriate adjustments will be proportionally made to spending categories outlined in the attached budget.
- 4. Method and basis of levying the assessment: The fee structure for assessments will remain as previously approved, including the change in classifications of businesses by temporarily creating a sub-classification for businesses that earn annual gross receipts of \$25,000 or less. Businesses which fall into this sub-classification would pay an annual assessment fee of \$60.00. This is not a property-based district, therefore, property owners are not assessed.
- 5. The amount of any surplus or deficit revenues to be carried over from the previous fiscal year: Our fiscal year ends on 2/28. The first calendar year disbursement of assessments occurs on 4/30; therefore, \$15,000 from the prior fiscal year will be carried over for recurring expenses for March and April of the upcoming fiscal year. If available, up to \$50,000 will be carried forward for planned Capital Projects expenditures in 2022 Examples of these projects are, district wide tree trimming and tree replacement, street banner replacement or holiday decoration replacement.
- 6. The amount of any contributions to be made from sources other than assessments levied: The Rockridge Business Improvement District will seek sponsorship funds for our promotional and beautification efforts. We also offer the opportunity for businesses outside our footprint to participate in our marketing efforts for a fee.

7. Annual Renewal Notice: Starting in 2014 the notice has to be sent every five years. The notice will be sent again in 2023 as the last notice was sent in 2018. Section 12 of Ordinance 12301 C.M.S., as amended by Ordinance 13261 C.M.S., now states: "The Governing Council (Advisory Board) of the Rockridge BID shall annually 45 days before the anniversary of the establishment of the Rockridge Business Improvement District Ordinance give the assessees of the District written notice of their rights to seek disestablishment of the district and the process therefore. Commencing with the year 2014, said notice shall no longer be required annually, but shall be given once every five years, with the next notice to be sent 45 days before the District's formation anniversary in the year 2018. In their annual report to Council, the Advisory Board shall report that they have provided this notice." Accordingly, the required notice was provided in 2018 and the next notice will be due in 2023.

Rockridge BID Key Accomplishments For 2021

The Rockridge District Association, non-profit management corporation of the Rockridge BID, (RDA) is coming out of the first round of the pandemic with one of the highest occupancy rates in a district in Oakland. Although we did see businesses close, those storefronts have been replaced very quickly with new businesses.

This year we have exceeded \$100,000 in our stewardship of tree maintenance and planting. Our efforts are continuing with respect to street cleaning, removal of hazardous newsstands, trash receptable maintenance and repainting blighted street poles.
