"RESOLVED: That the City Council hereby authorizes the City Administrator, or designee, to enter into a Professional Services Agreement with SST, Inc., to consolidate all three ShotSpotter phase area programs into a consolidated contract for the period of April 19, 2016 through April 18, 2017, for four hundred ninety-four thousand six hundred dollars (\$494,600), for the monitoring services of the ShotSpotter gunshot detection system. The option to renew for three additional one-year terms in an amount not to exceed \$1,483,800 (one million four hundred eighty-three thousand eight hundred dollars) shall be subject to availability of funds and approval by the City Council of the funds in the Oakland Police Department's baseline budget proposal; and be it"
