- requirements for community engagement and analysis
- · possible mission statement
- detailed estimated costs
- Initial investment requirement for a municipal bank to assume the responsibility of banking services
- · Potential revenue stream
- Partnership opportunities with credit unions, small business lending and mortgage lending
- · Opportunities and challenges for cannabis deposits
- Develop a credit scoring model that equitably reflects the risks of lending to underserved residents
- Quantify the impact of the transfer of investments and banking services unit to a municipal bank on the credit rating of Oakland
- Options and needs for initial capitalization of the bank

A motion was made by councilmember Gallo, and Seconded by Councilmember Kalb that the amendments provided by councilmember Kaplan be included in the Ordinance. The amendments are as follow;

- 1. Add subsection 4 to the definitions of "Eligible Depository" as set forth below:
- 4. "Does not "Support the Dakota Access Pipeline", "Violate Indigenous Sovereignty", or "Support Mass Incarceration" as defined below; and"
- 2. Add the following definitions in Section 2 to the Ordinance:
- F. "Support the Dakota Access Pipeline": Direct investment in, or provision of loans, credit, bonds or similar debt instruments, or underwriting services to, entities organized to carry out the construction of the Dakota Access Pipeline, operate the Dakota Access Pipeline, or operate pipeline and energy infrastructure connected to the Dakota Access Pipeline, As of December 2016, such companies include Energy Transfer Partners, Energy Transfer Equity L.P., Dakota Access LLC, and Sunoco Logistics,
- G. "Violate indigenous sovereignty": any act that: violates the standards set out in the international finance corporations environmental and social sustainability performance standards 7; or that violates articles 11, 12, or 25 of the united nations declaration on the rights of indigenous people; or that violates indigenous Peoples Right to free, prior and informed consent; or that violates a treaty of the United States.
- H. "Support Mass Incarceration": Direct investments in, or provision of loans, credit, bonds or similar debt instruments, or underwriting services to, for-profit corporations that own, lease or operate prisons, jails, immigration detention centers, or youth detention Centers."

A substitute motion was made by Vice Mayor Campbell Washington and seconded by President Pro Temp Guillen, that this amendment language be included in the RFP.

A Third Motion Was made by Councilmember Kalb, seconded by Councilmember Gallo to approve Councilmember Kaplan's amendments; however adding the language "to provide detailed information that the institution does not support...." before the amendment.
