"To maintain, protect and improve library services throughout Oakland, including: Providing safe places for children, teens after school; Preventing library closures; Maintaining youth reading programs, senior services; Keeping libraries safe/welcoming; Providing evening/weekend hours for students/working families, and Providing literacy services for adults; shall the City of Oakland establish a \$75 per parcel taxes for 20 years, providing about \$10,000,000 annually, subject to independent audits and citizens' oversight with exemptions for seniors/low-income residents?"
