And striking the following whereas clauses from page 2 of the legislation; " WHEREAS, the design of International Boulevard Pedestrian Lighting and Sidewalk Improvement Project was completed in 2018, and Fehr and Peers was the Engineer-of-Record for the design of pedestrian lighting; and

WHEREAS, it is within the best interest of the City to have Fehr and Peers to provide engineering support during construction of the project to ensure continuity of work; and

WHEREAS, the engineering service to be provided by Fehr and Peers is estimated to be \$400,000 which is approximately 4% of the construction cost of the project; and

WHEREAS, the Clean California funds will fund the professional service agreement with funds to be allocated in the following project account: California Department of Transportation (2140), Complete Streets Design Organization (35212), Architectural and Engineering Services Account (54411); Project number to be determined; and

WHEREAS, Oakland Municipal Code (OMC) section 2.04.051.A requires the City Administrator to conduct a request for proposals/qualifications (RFP/Q) process for professional services contracts, and OMC section 2.04.051.B allows Council to waive the RFP/Q requirements upon a finding by the Council that it is in the best interest for the City to do so; and

WHEREAS. Fehr and Peers does not meet either Local Business Enterprise (LBE) or the Small Local Business Enterprise (SLBE) requirement, and a waiver of the City's LBE and SLBE requirements is requested in order to execute a professional service agreement with Fehr and Peers; and

WHEREAS, the City lacks the qualified personnel to perform the necessary work and the City Council finds and determines that the performance of this contract is in the public interest; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that this contract is of a professional, scientific or technical and temporary in nature and shall not result in the loss of employment or salary by any person having permanent status in the competitive service; and"; and

The exemption shall apply in the same proportion that is exempted from ad valorem property tax";

adding to the end of section 7 "In no event shall the annual tax rate adjustments authorized by this subsection 7(B) exceed five percent (5%) of the tax rates imposed by the City of Oakland pursuant to this Ordinance in the immediately preceding fiscal year.";

on page 10, section 10 "C. Citizen Oversight. The City Council shall assign to an existing Board or Commission the responsibility for public oversight of this measure.
