- (1) that all ALPR data collected shall be destroyed after six months retention, except for specific information that has been identified within the six-month period as evidence in the commission of a crime per Section G of the October 6, 2022 SUP recommended by the PAC; and
- (2) that OPD shall provide the Privacy Advisory Commission (PAC) and the Council's Public Safety Committee with quarterly reports regarding the efficacy of ALPR, to include at minimum the a) case number, the b) date and time that the incident was reported to OPD, the c) justification for the database query, the d) date of any OPD action or response to the incident, the e) nature of the action or response, and f) confirmation as to whether and how ALPR assisted in resolution of the incident; and
- (3) that no data shall be used or shared with other agencies for the purposes of pursuing criminal charges or civil enforcement against individuals for obtaining, providing, or supporting reproductive health care services, to ensure that medical rights of residents of and visitors to Oakland, a sanctuary city, remain intact: and
- (4) that accessing the data shall be based on a standard of reasonable suspicion or greater and the section titled "Database Investigative Queries" in the October 6, 2022 SUP recommended by the PAC shall be amended to reflect the same: and
- (5) that OPD shall make reasonable efforts to restrict the usage of the ALPR technology to the public right of way and other public property, in the alignment with "Restrictions on USe (1) Invasion of Privacy" in the October 6, 2022 SUP recommended by the PAC."
