Recommendation: Adopt A Resolution Amending Resolution No. 89591 C.M.S., Which Authorized The City Administrator To Receive Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Reimbursement And Secure Emergency Non-Congregate Shelter For Displaced Residents Of The Coliseum Connections Project, To (1) Increase The Expenditure Authority From Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000) To Four Million Dollars (\$4,000,000), (2) Extend The Authority To Contract For Lodging Through July 31, 2023, Or The Completion Of Repairs, Whichever Occurs First, And (3) Increase The Allocation For The Required FEMA Local Match From One Hundred Twenty Five Thousand (\$125,000) To Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000)
