## **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

**Attachment A** to this biannual report provides information on crime, crime trends, crime reduction, and crime intervention activities in Oakland for October 2025 through March 2026.

## **BACKGROUND AND LEGISLATIVE HISTORY**

In 2013, the Public Safety Committee requested a quarterly report from OPD on crime trends and crime reduction activities in the City of Oakland. This report was provided four times a year and updated to include the preceding three-month period. At the Rules Committee meeting on March 23, 2023, there was a motion made and approved to change the reports' frequency from quarterly to biannual.

This informational report is presented to the City Council and the Oakland community to provide an update on crime and crime reduction activities in Oakland. The attached report (**Attachment A**) contains information as follows:

**RACE AND EQUITY:**


